Letter From Fr. Curtis

Dear Parishioners,

Our first religious education class will be on Sunday, October 4, following the 10:30 Mass at St. Paul's, and then on the first Sundays of the month throughout the school year. If you would like to register your child, please let me know.

The students who were supposed to be Confirmed last spring had to wait because of the pandemic. Their Confirmation has now been rescheduled for Sunday, October 25. If you haven't heard from me and think that your child is supposed to be Confirmed at this time, please contact me as soon as possible.

As you might know, Bishop Coyne is lowering the age of Confirmation from tenth grade to sixth grade, gradually through the next few years. This has led to some confusion, so here is a general guideline showing when students may expect to be Confirmed:

Current 10th graders- October 25, 2020

Current 9th graders- October 25, 2020

Current 8th graders- Spring 2021

Current 7th graders- Spring 2021

Current 6th graders- Spring 2022

Current 5th graders- Spring 2022

Current 4th graders- Spring 2023

(All subsequent years, students will be confirmed when they are in sixth grade, so the year of their Confirmation should be easy to figure out.)

These Confirmation years are not set in stone for every individual. Some of our young parishioners choose to wait to be Confirmed until they are older. We respect that decision, but we don't want anyone to fall through the cracks. If you were not Confirmed with your class, whether recently or decades ago, and you would now like to be Confirmed, please let me know. I would be happy to meet with you and determine how much preparation you might need. This could involve meeting for classes for a few weeks or throughout the year. I would be happy to help you receive this special Sacrament.

1386 Before so great a sacrament, the faithful can only echo humbly and with ardent faith the words of the Centurion: “Domine, non sum dignus ut intres sub tectum meum, sed tantum dic verbo, et sanabitur anima mea” (“Lord, I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof, but only say the word and my soul will be healed.”) Matthew 8:8. And in the Divine Liturgy of St. John Chrysostom the faithful pray in the same spirit: O Son of God, bring me into communion today with your mystical supper. I shall not tell your enemies the secret, nor kiss you with Judas’ kiss. But like the good thief I cry, “Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom.”

1387 To prepare for worthy reception of this sacrament, the faithful should observe the fast required in their Church. Bodily demeanor (gestures, clothing) ought to convey the respect, solemnity, and joy of this moment when Christ becomes our guest.


