This exhibit is based on the work of Blessed Carlo Acutis (1991-2006), an Italian teenager who died from leukemia and is now on his way to sainthood, who compiled descriptions of Eucharistic miracles from around the world. powerful presence in the Eucharist. It will be open at 5 p.m. Saturday and 3 p.m. Sunday, or upon request.

Question: What is the Catholic view on cremation of the body?

Answer: Traditionally, the Church was opposed to cremation because it was seen as a statement that the deceased person did not believe in the resurrection of the body. Catholics believe that the body and soul will be reunited at the end of time; the body will be glorified in a mysterious way, like the Body of the Risen Christ. When people choose cremation nowadays, it is not to deny the resurrection, but rather because it is less expensive. The Church still prefers the burial of a body, but it permits cremation, just so long as the remains (the ashes) are treated with the same respect as the body is, and they are buried (not spread or kept at home). Practically, this gives us a place where we can go to pray for our deceased loved ones. Many people don't know these rules of the Church, so it doesn't make someone a bad person if they requested that their ashes be spread or their ashes have been kept at home. If possible, the remains should be buried in a cemetery or a blessed grave. But even if someone's ashes have been spread, God can do all things. He can restore their body in the resurrection, just as He will restore the bodies of those who have decomposed in the grave, or those whose bodies were injured by accidents, sicknesses, or other misfortunes.
