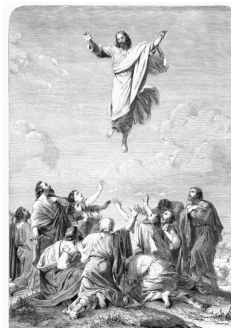

A Few Mothers Who Are Saints:

The Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of God

St. Elizabeth, cousin of the Virgin Mary who became the mother of St. John the Baptist after decades of praying to become a mother.



St. Monica, who faithfully prayed for her wayward son Augustine, who finally returned to the Church and became a saint, too.



St. Elizabeth Ann Seton, a widowed mother of five who converted to Catholicism, and then become a nun who established the first Catholic schools in the United States.



St. Zelig Martin, mother of St. Therese of Lisieux and four other daughters who entered religious life.



St. Gianna Beretta Molla, an Italian physician who sacrificed her life to save the life of her unborn child.

The late Pope Benedict concludes his trilogy of books, *Jesus of Nazareth*, with this description of Jesus' Ascension:

"Jesus departs in the act of blessing. He goes while blessing, and He remains in that gesture of blessing. His hands remain stretched out over this world. The blessing hands of Christ are like a roof that protects us. But at the same time, they are a gesture of opening up, tearing the world open so that Heaven may enter in, may become present within it.

"The gesture of hands outstretching in blessing expresses Jesus' continuing relationship to His disciples, to the world. In departing, He comes to us, in order to raise us up above ourselves and to open up the world to God. That is why the disciples could return home from Bethany rejoicing. In faith we know that Jesus holds His hands stretched out in blessing over us. That is the lasting motive of Christian joy."

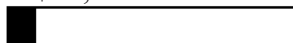
