

Dear Parishioners,

From time to time, the Diocese asks each parish to host a missionary, to share with the parishioners about his or her work of spreading the Gospel of Jesus Christ to all the ends of the earth, and to give us an opportunity to support this work with our prayers and donations. Next weekend, May 27-28, we will be welcoming Fr. Thomas Aquinas, a priest from India, who is serving as pastor of Mary, Queen of All Saints Parish in Hardwick. While Fr. Thomas is visiting and offering our three weekend Masses here, I will be away covering his three weekend Masses in his parish in the Hardwick area.

Fr. Thomas is a member of the Heralds of the Good News, a religious order dedicated to "the promotion of vocations to priesthood, the training of seminarians, and the supply of zealous and hardworking missionaries to dioceses in India and abroad which experience a shortage of priests due to the lack of local vocations." Often, we think of missionaries as people traveling to the far side of the world to proclaim the Gospel. While this is true for Fr. Thomas, what might be a new idea for us to consider is that *Vermont* is the far side of the world, and *we* are blessed to have missionary priests—like Fr. Thomas—who journey far from their homelands to serve our spiritual needs, because we sadly have such a shortage of young men willing to respond to God's call to serve Him in the priesthood.

Even looking at the seminarians studying for the priesthood for our Diocese, only two come from Vermont, while four have made the sacrifice to leave their homes in Vietnam to dedicate their lives as priests here in Vermont. Compare that to the average of twelve or thirteen Vermonters who were with me in seminary just a decade ago. It's humbling to see our scarcity of priestly vocations from our Diocese, but it should also be encouraging to see the missionaries who make so many sacrifices to come here and serve us. Let us pray that more young men will be inspired by their example to answer God's call to become good and holy priests.

Sadly, this past Sunday, May 14, some time between 2 and 7:30 p.m., someone entered St. Paul's Church and vandalized it. While the damage was not as terrible as it could have been, the disrespect to our Lord and to our parish community was very disheartening. Unfortunately, I now need to keep the church locked. This is sad because I know that so many of you benefit from taking time to stop by and pray throughout the week. I am working with a locksmith to install a keypad entry on the side door, which would allow you to get into the church outside of regular Mass times. I'll let you know when that is in place. (Thank you to a generous couple in the parish who are donating to make these security improvements possible.)

I'll confess that I was pretty angry about this vandalism, but with a few days to cool down, I know that what we need to do is pray for the people who did this. Very likely, they are a few neighborhood kids who have nothing better to do than cause mischief and who do not understand the gravity of their actions. Let us pray for them.

St. Philip Neri (1515-1595)

Feast Day: Friday, May 26

St. Philip was a priest and member of the Oratorian order, renowned for his joy and pastoral zeal, who served in Rome. He is often called a secondary apostle of Rome,



after the first apostles to Rome: Saints Peter and Paul, because his faithful ministry inspired a revival in faith during the troubling times of the Renaissance, when corruption and worldliness were rampant to the highest levels of Church leadership. It is said that his affable personality inspired greater faithfulness in Christ among everyone he met: from beggars to cardinals. Sometimes, we can be discouraged by problems in the Church, but let us strive to follow the example of people like St. Philip, who brought about positive change by their example of personal prayerfulness and holiness. Perhaps fittingly for such a loving priest, St. Philip is believed to have died from an enlarged heart.
