Dear Parishioners,

This Saturday, June 24, I am away for a wedding in New Hampshire, so Fr. Roger Charbonneau is covering the 4:00 p.m. Mass at St. Theresa's. I'll be back for the two Sunday morning Masses, and then I'll be away for a vacation Monday through Friday. I'll be visiting some seminary classmates in Rhode Island, where I spent my first four years in seminary. I haven't seen many of them in a long time, so this will be a nice trip.

While I'm away, if you have immediate pastoral needs, please call Mater Dei Parish in Newport at 802-334-5066 or Corpus Christi Parish in St. Johnsbury at 802-748-8129. If it's not an emergency or you'd like to leave a message for me when I return Friday night, feel free to contact our parish rectory.

Unfortunately, while I'm away, there will be no daily Masses in our parish, this Monday through Friday. I will remember you all in my prayers when I celebrate Masses during the week in Rhode Island. Unfortunately, I won't be here to celebrate the Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul with you on Thursday, June 29. This holy day commemorates the two greatest apostles, who came from very different backgrounds, yet both responded to Jesus' call to proclaim His Gospel to the world. St. Peter was a simple fisherman, who called himself "a sinful man," yet he became the leader among Jesus' twelve Apostles, our first pope. He boldly proclaimed his faith that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, yet he also fearfully denied even knowing Jesus when He was arrested. But after Jesus' resurrection, Peter repented and assumed leadership of the early Church. St. Paul was a pharisee and a tent-maker, who cruelly persecuted the early Christians. Yet he, too, repented when Jesus appeared to him miraculously on the road to Damascus. Paul became a prolific Apostle, spreading the Faith all around the Roman Empire on several journeys, and he wrote many letters of instruction and encouragement to the early Christian communities that we still read today as part of the New Testament. Both offered the ultimate witness to Christ as martyrs in Rome.
