

Forever Young Ministry

This newly created ministry for our parishioners 55+ has flourished and grown into an active ministry at our parish. We are so glad for this fellowship opportunity.

Fireside Chats

Parishioners started hosting small gatherings in their homes to foster fellowship and encourage discussion. Father Robert attends each of these events and is available to respond to parishioner questions and concerns.

Stephen Ministry

A number of parishioners completed 50 hours of training and will be commissioned as Stephen Ministers this Spring. Stephen Ministers provide one-to-one Christian care to people experiencing a crisis or going through a difficult time.

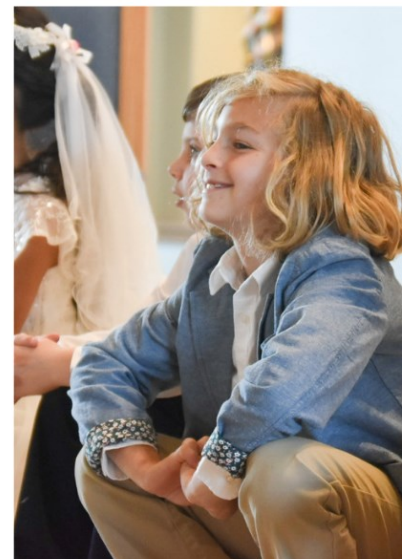

THE ART OF DYING DAILY

The Resurrection. This, indeed, is the central mystery of our faith. Jesus, allowing himself to be consumed with passion for righteousness and swallowed by death has, in turn, conquered death once and for all with the power that is the promise of eternal life.

Christ's pathway of passion, death and resurrection was personal: it was unique. It had been fashioned by the Father from all eternity. Jesus was faithful to God's vision for Him. Jesus embraced His vocation as the humble, gentle Messiah. Jesus suffered the pain of death. Jesus experienced the power of rising again.

God has fashioned a personal path for each of us from all eternity. Each of us has a unique role to play in the Father's never-ending revelation of divine life, divine love, divine justice, divine peace and divine reconciliation. Still, the way to resurrection is the way of the cross - the way of giving up, the way of letting go, the way of surrendering any and all things, thoughts, attitudes and actions that prevent us from embodying the passion of Christ: the passion for all that is righteous and true.

Saint Francis de Sales offers this image in Book 9 of his Treatise on the Love of God: "So, too, we must strip ourselves of all affections, little and great, and make a frequent examination of our heart to see if it is truly ready to divest itself of all its garments, as Isaiah did. Then, at the proper time, we must take up again the affections suitable to the service of charity, so that we may die naked on the cross with our divine Savior and afterward rise again with him as new people."

Be certain of one thing: the daily dying to self that is part of living a passionate life is not about dying, stripping and letting go for its own sake. No, it is that all of who we are may be purified to more faithfully and effectively live lives of divine passion and compassion. God does not desire that we die to self out of self-deprecation but that we die to self in order that, paradoxically, we may actually be more of who God calls us to be.

"Love is as strong as death to enable us to forsake all things," wrote Saint Francis de Sales. "It is as magnificent as the Resurrection to adorn us with glory and honor."

This glory and honor is not just reserved for Heaven. To the extent that we die a little each day and experience the fidelity of God's love in the midst of all adversity, trials, struggles and "letting go," we can experience something of the Resurrection every day.

JOY TO THE WORLD

For over a thousand years, Christians around the world pray the “Angelus.” Some people pray it every day, some pray it three times a day. This prayer calls to mind the mystery of the Incarnation and the importance of Christ becoming human. The title of the prayer comes from the first words describing this momentous event: “The angel of the Lord declared unto Mary and she conceived of the Holy Spirit.” This prayer is a daily reminder of Advent, Christmas and the joy that the birth of Christ brought to our world.

During the Easter Season, the Angelus is traditionally replaced by the “Regina Caeli” prayer. This is a hymn that is addressed to the Virgin Mary using her title as “Queen of Heaven” (in Latin, Regina Caeli). The words remind us that the Son of Mary, whose birth brought joy to the world, brings even more joy through the glory of His Resurrection. The end of the prayer specifically addresses the God “who gave joy to the world”

The phrase “joy to the world” reminds me of Christmas, specifically the great Christian hymn with that title. “Joy to the World” was written in the early 18th century by Isaac Watts, a Methodist minister from England who based his poem on Psalm 98. The psalm tells us to “sing joyfully to the Lord, all you lands; break into song, sing praise (verse 4)!”

The song was not written to commemorate the birth of Jesus but the return of Christ at the end of time. Watts believed that the whole world, “heaven and nature,” should celebrate the triumphant return of the Lord with joy.

Since the Advent and Christmas Seasons are both a remembrance of the past and a hope for the future, the song easily fits the theme of the second coming of Christ. Over time, this idea became secondary, and the song is almost exclusively associated with the first coming of Christ in the little town of Bethlehem.

Something similar happened to the “Hallelujah Chorus” from Handel’s Messiah. This classic piece of music is actually about the Resurrection of Jesus. It was written to celebrate Easter Sunday. Today it is primarily linked to the Christmas Season. All of this is a reminder that Christmas and Easter are always connected. The joy of the angel Gabriel, the joy of the heavenly hosts, the joy brought to the world at that first Christmas, finds its culmination at Easter. The “glad tidings” of Christmas are remembered precisely because we believe that the death of Jesus was not their end. Professor C. Kevin Rowe (Duke Divinity School) summarizes this when he wrote: “not only does Easter resurrect the promises of Christmas; it also transforms them” (“Why Christmas Needs Easter,” 2012).

During this Paschal Season, whatever prayers we pray or songs we play, I hope that we can all experience Easter tidings... tidings of comfort and joy... joy to the world!
