

LEARNING LITURGICAL FORMATION

Last weekend we had our Masses in "Slow Motion" with commentary designed to help us better understand and participate in the liturgy. Thank you to our commentators Adrienne Manhard, Carol Vroom, and Mary Kennery for the time spent preparing.

The Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy, the first document of the Second Vatican Council, instructed, "With zeal and patience, pastors of souls must promote the liturgical instruction of the faithful, and also their active participation in the liturgy both internally and externally..." Pope Francis wrote an entire Apostolic Letter on liturgical formation, "Desiderio Desideravi" in 2022. In it he wrote, "The non-acceptance of the liturgical reform, as also a superficial understanding of it, distracts us from the obligation of finding responses to the question that I come back to repeating: how can we grow in our capacity to live in full the liturgical action? How do we continue to let ourselves be amazed at what happens in the celebration under our very eyes? We are in need of a serious and dynamic liturgical formation." The "Mass in Slow Motion" was one small way of addressing this challenge of liturgical formation. But, as Francis says, we are in need of more serious and dynamic methods than have been tried thus far.

One example is Catechesis of the Good Shepherd which we offer here at Holy Infant. This formation model for children starting at preschool age immerses them into a world of liturgical imagination, discovering for themselves the language of symbols and the sacred stories of faith in a way that dwells in their hearts. The activities of CGS teach kids that faith especially as experienced liturgically isn't something you receive passively, but a story you are part of and action in which you participate. This is the type of formation we need to promote and develop.

We're putting together a liturgical formation page on our

website that I hope becomes a hub of resources, whether it be book recommendations, videos, retreat possibilities or FAQs (including video from our Mass in Slow Motion last weekend). I hope it's a place that is



continually updated and remains dynamic as Pope Francis has asked!

WEEKLY SCRIPTURE REFLECTIONS

Joshua 24:1–2a, 15–17, 18b We will serve the Lord, for he is our God.

Psalm 34 "Taste and see the goodness of the Lord." Ephesians 5:21–32 This is a great mystery, regarding Christ and the church.

John 6:60–69 To whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life.

For the Chosen People and Jesus' disciples, this is the moment of truth. They must make a choice: serve the Lord or leave. Joshua, in addressing this question to all the people, gets one response, while Jesus, in addressing all his disciples, receives a different one. Saint Paul tells the Ephesians that we, the Church, are members of Christ's body and that Christ loves the Church as a husband loves his wife.

As we hear God's word, let us insert ourselves in each reading and make our choice.

Next weekend we celebrate the Twenty-Second Sunday of Ordinary Time when we return to hearing from the Gospel of Mark which teaches us to put the commands of God ahead of human rules.

ALWAYS TIME TO BUILD & REBUILD

I recently visited Our Mother of Consolation School (OMC), in Philadelphia, PA. This parish elementary school is undergoing total renovation due to the fire that destroyed the entire school last year, which also happened to be Fr. John Fisher's, OSFS, first year as pastor. I am quite sure that having to deal with a fire and its aftermath was not on his list of goals and hoped-for accomplishments when he took the role several months before the fire. Having lived with Fr. Fisher in Camden, NJ I did not doubt that if anyone could navigate the parish through this tragedy and begin the process of rebuilding, it would be him.

The purpose of my visit was to check out the wall space so I could get to work on the various artworks Fr. Fisher has commissioned for the newly renovated school, including the elevator doors! I have been anxious to get started on the project for some months now, and my excitement only grew when the foreman, Larry, told us we had to wear hard hats to enter the building. I had never worn one before and may now adopt it as a religious habit!)

When Father Judge High School (Philadelphia, PA) President Brian King gave me a private tour of the new automotive center currently under construction I had a similar experience. (Sadly, we didn't get to wear hard hats.) The new center is being built on the very same spot where the Oblate faculty house stood for over six decades. Thanks to Brian's and Fr. Joe Campellone's OSFS, wildly creative imaginations, the new center will serve and educate kids from over 50 zip codes! Part of my visit that day involved a tour of the original school building where Brian showed me a long hallway with plain white walls...but not for long! We are now making plans for a community mural project to illustrate seven principles of Salesian Spirituality.

Father Judge has graduated many men who went on to become Oblates. One such Oblate was recently inducted into the Father Judge Hall of Fame and re-elected as our Superior General. In June, Most Rev. Barry Strong, OSFS, was selected as leader of our worldwide Congregation. I particularly loved the photo of Fr. Barry with the newly elected General Council in a colorful display of cultural diversity: one Oblate from India; one from Africa; and one from South America! These men will lead our Congregation as we continue to work to build a world touched by the gentle spirituality of our patrons.

Even though none of the guys in the photo were wearing a hard hat, I can't help but feel that the Holy Spirit, our Divine Foreman, is working overtime these days, leading us and guiding us to new and creative ways to Live Jesus; helping us to build and rebuild our Oblate identity and presence in an ever-changing world and church.
