SING TO THE LORD

In their instruction on sacred music "Sing to the Lord" the US bishops wrote:

"Among all other instruments which are suitable for divine worship, the organ is 'accorded pride of place' because of its capacity to sustain the singing of a large gathered assembly, due to both its size and its ability to give 'resonance to the fullness of human sentiments, from joy to sadness, from praise to lamentation.' Likewise, 'the manifold possibilities of the organ in some way remind us of the immensity and the magnificence of God.' In addition to its ability to lead and sustain congregational singing, the sound of the pipe organ is most suited for solo playing of sacred music in the Liturgy at appropriate moments. Pipe organs also play an important evangelical role in the Church's outreach to the wider community in sacred concerts, music series, and other musical and cultural programs. For all of these reasons, the place of the organ should be taken into account from the outset in the planning process for the building or renovation of churches."

Because of its importance to the liturgical life of the community, the Church provides a special blessing for organs in the Book of Blessings. The blessing of our organ at Holy Infant will take place Sunday, October 27th at 3pm, followed by a recital by Rudy Lucente, the organist who designed our particular console.

The liturgy for the blessing is interesting because it specifies that the organ should not be played until it is being blessed by being incensed. Therefore our first song and the responsorial psalm during the Liturgy of the Word will be sung unaccompanied. Fr. Robert will then incense the organ while it is played for the first time, followed by a closing hymn, and then onto the recital itself.

Rudy is known for his family friendly organ concerts that feature the instrument in a way that is enjoyable



whether or not you are an organ music connoisseur. You can hear directly from Rudy about his philosophy of organ music in the podcast episode released this Thursday. The console itself will be moved to the front of the church so the audience can enjoy watching while he plays.

The entire event with the blessing and recital should be just over an hour long, followed by a reception with refreshments where you can meet and talk with Rudy. This will be a great opportunity to experience and learn more about our organ directly from the designer. Hope to see you all there!

WEEKLY SCRIPTURE REFLECTIONS

Isaiah 53:10-11 Psalm 33 Hebrews 4:14-16 Mark 10:35-45

The theme running through today's readings is service and our Lord's commitment to be the servant of all. Isaiah prophesies about a servant who will suffer and give his life as an offering for sin. The reading from Hebrews reminds us that Jesus was tested in every way, willing to become weak for our sake. In the Gospel, Jesus tells his disciples he came not to be served but to serve. Let today's readings inspire us to serve others as we live out our faith.

Looking at my life right now, how is Jesus summoning me? How can I be of service in my family, my parish, my community?

Next weekend we celebrate the Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time when we hear the goodness that God grants us in new perspective and joy.

ONE THING LEFT

At this very moment, my students in our Salesian Leadership class are preparing presentations drawing upon Fr. Thomas Dailey's, OSFS, book, Live Today Well. Based upon our Oblate rule of life, the Spiritual Directory, Fr. Dailey provides a practical strategy to unite oneself with God throughout the day. When does this strategy start? It begins at the beginning, with our rising. How do we wake up?

Take a moment and reflect, "What are your first thoughts when you wake up in the morning?" I asked a few people this question, here are their answers:

- Oh, can I do it all over again?
- I didn't get enough sleep!
- I don't have enough time today!
- Who should I text (snap) first?
- Five more minutes.
- What day is it?
- Father, I don't have any thoughts.

My student, Brent, decided to present this chapter about rising. He did an excellent job capturing St. Francis' insight: when we awake, direct our first thought to God and use a short passage from scripture to do this. After presenting, Brent asked me, "Father, is there anything I'm missing?" "Oh," I said, "There is only one thing left... Do it." Brent checks in with the class every day. Some mornings he remembers, others he forgets. Such is the spiritual journey! I give him great credit for persevering again and again.

I can relate to Brent, my morning thoughts often focus on deficit - not enough time, sleep, or energy. I've lost the practice of thinking of God. Brent has inspired me to try again. I will invite him to ask me, "Father, did you think of God this morning?"

With prayer, there is only one thing left...do it. May God be Praised!
