Welcome & Announcements

HOST

Good [evening/morning] and welcome to Holy Infant as we gather together to celebrate the Fifth Sunday of Lent.

My name is [your name]

It's our tradition to invite all guests who are with us to introduce themselves so we may welcome you. Do we have any guests with us?

★ Please stand, tell us who you are, and where you're from. ★

Pause while people stand. After each introduction, say something like...

Welcome to Holy Infant! Applause greets each guest.

If you're with us for the first time, or back after a while away, we'd love to hear from you. [Hold up example Connect Card] Please fill out a Connect Card from your pew and drop it in the collection basket during the offertory. As a thanks for returning your card, we'll make a donation to one of three service organizations of your choice that our parish supports.

Now, in the spirit of St. Francis de Sales, let's turn and greet one another.

Pause while people greet one another and continue with the announcements once the assembly returns to quiet.

You can still hear Mass out in the Narthex if you need to step out. We also have our family and children's rooms to my right towards the Chapel, with a video live feed from the Church.

Several announcements today:

- 1. The Holy Infant Golf Association took a mulligan last weekend with the rain, so its 2024 season begins this Saturday, March 23rd, at Hillandale. They have a great season planned and new golfers are always welcome. See the website or talk to Ray Zeillman for details.
- 2. Holy Infant's Prayer Labyrinth is a prayerful way to journey with Jesus especially during these final days of Lent and Holy Week.
