

MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parish Family,

This Third Sunday of Lent, we hear about Jesus' encounter with the Samaritan woman at the well. This woman went to the well at noon (in the heat of the day) precisely because she didn't want to meet anyone there. We can assume she felt rejected among the other Samaritan women (who went to the well in the cool of the morning) because of her five former husbands and because the man she was living with was not her husband. This rejection likely led her to feel abandoned, unlovable, and somewhat hopeless in her own future. You can almost hear her say, "Why even bother with marriage with my current boyfriend? If he's like all the other men I've been with, he'll just end up hurting me again. At least without marriage it will be easier to get out of the relationship once things turn bad, and I won't feel so ashamed in front of everybody else." It is in this state of heart that Jesus meets the Samaritan woman at the well.

Like this hurting woman, all of us have wounds in our hearts that lead us to believe the lie that it's better not to draw close to others or to God because we'll only end up getting hurt again. Scripture shows how we all can relate to this experience of our fallen nature. Men and women of every age have become disillusioned because of the broken realities of our world and our very lives. It is easy to give up hope here. Jesus meets us precisely in this state of affairs. By gentle nudging, He gets us to open up to our thirst for communion and intimacy, our desire to love and be loved in a total and unconditional way. God only knows how to love in this unconditional, total way. He shows us that He alone can give this kind of love that we so desperately need and want. He shows us how, like Him, we too can become wells of lifegiving water to quench the thirst of those who need and desire love.

We live in secular times where this need and desire for God's unconditional love, awakened by faith, is stifled in so many unsatisfactory ways by our culture. Indeed, many in our society, like this Samaritan woman, have become numb or disillusioned to the point that they don't even know that they thirst to love and be loved unconditionally! Jesus wants to work with, in, and through you and me to awaken all souls to the deepest desires of their heart which can be fulfilled in Him! God is love. For this our souls thirst, and only God can quench that thirst within us.

Keeping the Faith Strategic Plan for Catholic Elementary Schools: I am delighted to include the *Keeping the Faith* Summary Plan for Catholic Elementary Schools in this weekend's bulletin. Every parish, regardless of whether they have a school or not, is called upon to support and promote Catholic elementary education as a means of catechesis and evangelization for young disciples of Christ.

The *Keeping the Faith* Strategic plan highlights six key areas to strengthen our Catholic schools: Catholic Identity, Academic Excellence, Leadership & Talent, Finance, Governance, and Marketing. Please review the summary plan to stay informed on the plan as it unfolds here in our local Lake-Geauga region, and throughout the diocese. Our school principal, Mrs. Julie Fedak, will include her remarks about the plan in the bulletin for the next two weekends.

9 Nights of Night Prayer at St. Patrick Parish: St. Patrick Parish is one of 9 host parishes in our diocese for this round of "9 Nights of Night Prayer." Come to St. Patrick Church to any or all nights from Friday, March 17 through Saturday, March 25. The church doors open at 8:00 p.m., and night prayer begins at 8:15 p.m. This is an opportunity to pray Night Prayer, the short, ancient prayer of the Catholic Church in nine beautiful churches of our diocese. Every night, all nine of these churches will be open for those who come to church often, those who have never been, and everyone in between. Learn more at https://www.dioceseofcleveland.org/9nights.

Lastly, please see the Support School Choice paragraph in this weekend's bulletin, or visit our parish website or Facebook page, and follow the Voter Voice link to contact your state senator to show your support for the new "Parent Educational Freedom Act." If passed, parents would be given a scholarship to send each of their K-12 children to the school of their choice that accepts the EdChoice scholarships. Each K-8 student would be eligible for a \$5,500.00 scholarship. Each high school student would be eligible for a \$7,500.00 scholarship. Moreover, all local taxes still stay with the local public school district, and the bill will increase the homeschool tax credit from \$250.00 to \$2,000.00 per year. This legislation will keep our public schools strong while also giving parents the choice to choose affordable Catholic education for their children. This is another win-win, low hanging fruit, game changer for the sustainability and growth of our Catholic schools, and I encourage you to take 5 minutes to pledge your support.



PRINCIPAL'S CORNER

St. Mary School is one of the pilot schools in the diocesan Keeping the Faith initiative. This means that we are one of the first schools to incorporate the ideas from the plan, and we are in a great position to accomplish this. Keeping the Faith is a strategic plan that focuses on six important areas: Catholic Identity, Academic Excellence, Leadership and Talent, Finance, Governance, and Marketing. Many of the compliments I have heard about St. Mary can be directly related to this plan.

Parishioners and school families have noticed how proud St. Mary is to be a Catholic school. This is by design. When we put a focus on our Catholic faith, good things happen. For St. Mary, faith is the first part of our mission which also aligns with the diocesan strategic plan. To further this initiative, we will look into ways to incorporate faith and mission formation programs for our students, families, and employees.

Academic Excellence is the second part of the plan. Academic Excellence commits us to a high standard of learning, instruction, and assessment of the core subjects and more. We will share our data with the parents so they can see the progress of their children. Our curriculum is already standards based and, as announced at the State of the School, St. Mary is moving to a standards-based reporting system. Teachers will continue to research and infuse best practices that are researched based into the classrooms. The academic program will include support programs for the students' social and emotional needs to foster spiritual, personal, and academic growth of each student.

Leadership and Talent are required for Catholic schools to be successful. The diocese will develop a centralized recruitment strategy to attract talented and diverse candidates committed to Catholic education. In addition, onboarding processes will be developed to support priests and leaders so that communication will be clear and responsibilities will be defined. Professional development will help build leaders in our schools to help strengthen our schools. We all have heard of the difficulties of hiring good people, this is true for Catholic schools as well. As this strategic plan is realized, the Diocese of Cleveland will work with its elementary schools to overcome this obstacle.



SUPPORT SCHOOL CHOICE

The "Parent Educational Freedom Act" is in Ohio's Senate Education Committee, and now is the time to let your voice be heard! If passed, every Ohio student would be eligible for \$5,500.00 for grades K-8, and \$7,500.00 for grades 9-12, to be used at

any chartered non-public school that accepts the EdChoice scholarships. This enables the state's education funding formula to support students where their parents want them to attend. Use the link: (https://www.votervoice.net/OHCATHOLIC/Campaigns/101143/Respond) or scan the QR code to contact your Ohio Senator. There are two important items to remember about this bill: All local taxes still stay with the local public district. The bill also increases the homeschooling expenses that a taxpayer can claim for an income tax credit from \$250.00 to \$2,000.00 a year.
