PARENTS MATTER: PART 3

When I was 7 years old, I remember staring at the back of a box of Cheerios at breakfast. It promised that a working model submarine would be rushed to my house as soon as I accumulated 10 box tops. I was all in. Mom and Dad approved. Eventually, we hit the magic number. Mom sent the box tops to General Mills, per the instructions. Every day, I expected a large box from Minneapolis. It took forever, but, finally, a small envelope arrived. It contained a two-inch plastic submarine with a tiny compartment for baking powder, which would allow it to rise from the bottom of the bath tub once per use.

Children's imaginations know no bounds. Their expectations expand to meet their desires. Those expectations, especially when manipulated by adults, promise fully satisfying results but often deliver only two-inch submarines. Adults can coax gullible children to question their sexual identity, and lead them to expect a satisfying excursion into the world of another sex. Their expectations expand to meet their desires. Ultimately, they discover the grim truth: boys cannot actually become girls, and vice-versa. The attempt results in profound disappointment, self-loathing and distress.

The proposed Ohio constitutional amendment would expose children to the influence of any adult operating outside the reach of the parents. Those who have access to children, such as teachers, would be in a position to suggest highly destructive surgeries and therapies, and accompany the children to a clinic in pursuit of their dreams.

The proposed amendment confers the right on every individual "to make and carry out" a full panoply of reproductive health care decisions. "Every individual" includes children and excludes parents as potential intruders. How so? The amendment allows every individual to make and carry out "*one's own*" reproductive decisions. If the parents object, they have no right to substitute their own judgment for their child's. As a constitutional amendment, it would override any State laws or statutes that contradict it.

The amendment guards "an individual's voluntary exercise of this right." Might an argument be made that a 10-year-old child is incapable of exercising any voluntary right? If the child is accompanied by an adult, say, a teacher, or an organization such as Planned Parenthood, the amendment suggests that such a person or entity could be acting in place of the parents (*in loco parentis*), although the amendment does not specify this. Sometimes laws make exceptions for a "mature minor" who makes a healthcare decision. Such a minor must be able to make a decision with "informed consent," which presumes the ability to comprehend the information given by the doctor and to make a mature judgment. These issues could have been addressed through careful drafting. They were not.

What if a teenager, unaccompanied by an adult, were to request sterilization services at a clinic? Ohio law permits minor children to enter into voidable contracts. In other words, a 16-year-old child may make a contract for a medical procedure, and, after the service is rendered, refuse to pay for it. However, the parents would remain liable for all expenses since courts have held that medical expenses are necessities. See *State, University of Cincinnati Hosp. v. Cohen* (1989, 1st App. Dist.) 57 Ohio App. 3d 30. The clinic would be under no obligation to contact the parents, and yet the parents would be required to pay the clinic. After all, parents don't matter—unless it comes to paying the bills.

According to the U.S. Supreme Court's decision in *Bellotti v. Baird*, 443 U.S. 622 (1979), if a court finds a girl to be sufficiently mature and well informed, she may decide whether to have an abortion without parental knowledge or consent, regardless of a state's statutes. If the girl is not mature enough to make the decision, the court may rule that it is in the best interests of that particular child to have an abortion, regardless of the opposition of the parents. The recent reversal of court-recognized abortion rights contained in *Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Org.*, 142 S.Ct. 2228 (2022) may well overturn *Bellotti*, but the Ohio amendment would render that discussion completely academic. The amendment appears to eliminate even the need for a finding of the minor individual's maturity, and would allow a minor to make his or her "own reproductive decision" without regard to his or her competence.

In fact, the Ohio amendment is so poorly drafted, leaves so many questions unanswered and goes so far as to be very possibly unconstitutional at the federal level. When it comes to disputes with states regarding the upbringing of children, the Supreme Court has long recognized that parents have substantive due process rights guaranteed under the 14th Amendment. For example, the state has no right to forbid parents from teaching children to read in German, nor can it forbid parents from educating their children as they choose. In addition, the State cannot unreasonably infringe on other basic rights, such as "the right to marry, establish a home and bring up children." See *Meyer v. Nebraska*, 262 U.S. 390 (1923) and *Pierce v. Society of Sisters*, 268 U.S. 510 (1925). Along those same lines, might the Court also hold that the state cannot, in every case, regardless of circumstances, substitute the judgment of a child or its own judgment for the parents' judgment regarding the full range of reproductive healthcare decisions for their immature minor child? Yet the proposed Ohio amendment envisions just such a result.

When I was 7, I learned something about the world and my own gullible imagination. Fortunately, I had loving parents who taught me a valuable lesson, and a government that allowed them to teach it. Indeed, parents matter.

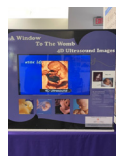

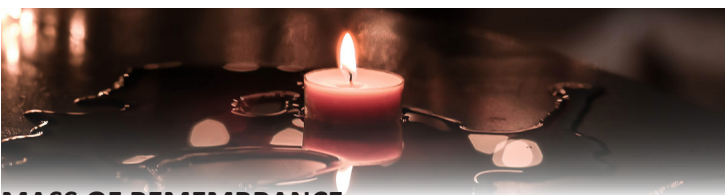

This year, we are hoping our parish will meet the unique challenges that we see around us. 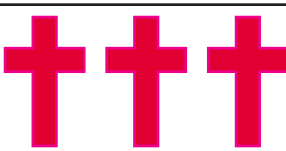
