PARENTS MATTER: PART 4

The Ohio Amendment and Administrative Rapture

Those who support the Ohio Reproductive Rights amendment on the November ballot unwittingly display what Dostoevsky called an "administrative rapture" fueled by sentimentality. In his 1872 novel, *Demons*, a character calls attention to Russia's "administrative rapture" which thrills any bureaucrat to think, "Come, I'll show my power over you." Later, that character's son observes that sentimentality drives that administrative rapture.

Both tendencies play their role in the proposed Ohio amendment. First, the State knows best and stands ready to show its power over "individuals," and, second, the amendment's provisions are based on a sentimental and paternalistic view of "individuals." Previously, we considered how unrealistically the amendment treats children as miniature adults. The amendment also treats women in a sentimental and paternalistic way.

To illustrate the amendment's sentimental and paternalistic concept of women, consider how the amendment would handle this case: What if a pregnant woman discovers that she has cancer? Assume her doctors recommend chemotherapy to get rid of the cancer, but they tell her it will surely kill the fetus. Let's say that she makes the decision to forego cancer treatments until after she gives birth. The doctors indicate that there's a 90% chance that she will not survive if she postpones chemotherapy. But she's determined. She wants to give her child a chance.

In a fit of administrative rapture, the State, under the terms of the amendment, can intervene and force the woman to take chemotherapy because it can demonstrate that ". . . it is the least restrictive means to advance the individual's health in accordance with widely accepted and evidence-based standards of care."

Shouldn't that decision be left to the mother? Yet the State could overrule her. What sort of sentimental conception of a woman governs such a decision? In the State's view, the woman simply does not know what is best for her. The State has pre-determined that only "the individual's health" need be considered, whereas the mother may choose to include her child's welfare too. The mother's thought process may well include her pre-born baby, and give rise to a more complex, a more subtle, a more loving decision than the State. Yet the State could overrule her.

Exactly what State entity would perform this task remains unclear. Who would initiate the process? How? The proposed amendment specifies that "State" means "any governmental entity and political subdivision." Once again, the drafters have thoughtlessly thrown the net over as wide a territory as possible. Literally, "any governmental entity" would include federal as well as local administrative offices (and their bureaucrats) regardless of their competence to make healthcare decisions. The reference to "any political subdivision" suggests that any official will do, whether it be a township trustee, a police chief, or a zoning board member. They all represent governmental entities, and would qualify to act under the proposed amendment. To address this issue, it is conceivable that the State might create a governmental

entity to demonstrate when it can overrule an individual's decision, say, a "Reproductive Health Review Board." It may also create the means by which it discovers when individuals are making choices that are unfavored, perhaps by a mandatory reporting system for doctors.

Some people fear that Ohio's present law does not cover enough legitimate abortions. But the present law does allow abortions to save the life of the mother. For example, if that pregnant woman contracts cancer, and needs chemotherapy to save her life, present law in Ohio allows her to have chemotherapy—even though it will certainly kill her baby. The Church also allows the operation under the law of "double-effect." It's her choice. Technically, the Church does not consider the administration of chemotherapy in these circumstances as abortion, although some others might define it as such.

If citizens think that further exceptions are needed, they still should vote against the amendment because the proposal opens the door to ALL abortions and ALL gender surgeries for ANY individual – whose decision may be overridden by the State. Narrow cases call for small adjustments to statutes, not wide-ranging, poorly drafted Constitutional amendments.

Dostoevsky wrote prophetically of his homeland Russia. Little did he know that he wrote prophetically of Ohio as well. It is time to awaken from the administrative rapture into which our State is falling. Vote "No" on the amendment in November, and help preserve a realistic concept of children, women and men.
