

I was born in Mexico City. I was a typical child attending Sunday Masses, getting a bit involved in church activities, and getting my sacraments. I never attended catholic school, though. One thing that I do remember while in Mexico, was this crucifix with Jesus on it, but the two parts would separate somehow. So, once I discovered that, I used to unhang Jesus from the cross and lay him on my bed. I used to keep thinking how tiresome it would be to hang there all day long every day! I was sure he needed a break. I would do so, then, go play outside. When it was time to go to bed, I would put him back on the cross. That never felt right. When I was 14, I came to California. Before I started my senior year, I prayed to God to let me find a wonderful friend to spend that year with and have a blast. God was so kind that he did. I had a wonderful senior year! My trust in God started to build. About a year later, I was invited to a charismatic family prayer group. From there, I was eventually invited to travel to Italy so discern my religious vocation. I took two months and a half to confirm that I was too attracted to guys to become a nun. I came back to California. Got involved with the Focolare movement (Marian Organization) and started a missionary group at my church. During that time, I also decided to complete my bachelor's in Biblical Studies. My professional experience during that time was back office Mortgage and Financing. Eventually I met my husband and got married. Due to the financial situation back in 2007, I was transferred by my company to San Antonio Texas. That bank only lasted six months after that. I already had one child, so I had to act quickly. The opportunity to become a bilingual teacher came and I took it. I only volunteering at church on a part time basis due to family life. Until then, I had not been able to get a job at a church. I prayed again and a door opened. I became the DRE at my parish. It was a wonderful experience! I was finally doing what I loved! The only issue was that the salary was not enough to pay the bills. I had to go back to teaching. I did not want to give up my dream, so I prayed again to have the chance to start my master's. God granted me that opportunity, and last summer I started my Master's in Pastoral Ministry with a concentration in Spiritual Direction. Now, I find myself in Indiana. I believe that I have been given the chance to work in my dream job. So, I pray with all my heart and soul to not let God and his people down.

God has been good to me. It has not been easy, but he has always been there for me. The Lord has always sent angels to help me, guide me, teach me, support me...and the Holy Spirit never misses a chance to teach me a lesson and get me closer to God. My walk with the Lord (through prayer), has been amazing! There has been ups, downs, and opportunities to experience all the emotions to the fullest. Mother Mary is currently teaching me to trust the Lord as she did; not an easy task, but so much worth it.

My highest devotion is the Eucharist. My favorite prayer is the rosary to the Holy Spirit and my favorite image is the Sacred Heart. I am fully convinced that the secret for a personal relationship with God is through obedience, and the perfect demonstration of that is Gethsemane.
