

July is the Month of the Most Precious Blood



July is the month dedicated to the Precious Blood. This month is a time to be reminded of Christ's gift of His most precious blood Throughout the Scriptures, we read of the many ancient covenants that are associated with blood. In addition, the pelican is an ancient symbol of Christ. It was believed that the mother pelican would pierce its own breast to feed its young with her blood to prevent the baby pelican from starvation or death. The mother pelican would lose her life to save the life of her baby pelicans.

May we receive the Eucharist with gratitude for the Lamb of God who died for our salvation. The story of the Pelican reminds us that the Eucharist, the Body and Blood of our Lord, feeds and nourishes us when we receive Him at every Mass. In each of the sacraments, one experiences the outpouring of God's grace, love and mercy.

Pope Francis on the Precious Blood of Jesus (June 30, 2018)

"God chose the sign of blood because no other sign can express so eloquently the supreme love of a life given for others. It is important to be brave people, building courageous communities that are not afraid to stand up to affirm the values of the Gospel and the truth about the world and man.." He goes on to say, "But let us not forget that the true strength of Christian witness comes from the Gospel itself. And this is where the centrality of the Blood of Christ and its spirituality emerges. It is a question of relying above all on the "superabundance of love" expressed in the Blood of the Lord, which brought to light the Church Fathers and the great saints and mystics of Christian history, from Saint Bonaventure to Saint Catherine of Siena, up to a Saint especially dear to you: Saint Gaspar del Bufalo. This Roman priest, founder of the Missionaries of the Most Precious Blood, endeavored to keep alive the ardor of faith in the Christian people by traveling through the regions of central Italy. With the example of his love for God, his humility, his charity, he was able to bring reconciliation and peace everywhere, tending to the spiritual and material needs of the most fragile people who lived on the margins of society."

Pope John XXIII (June 30, 1960)

"You know well enough that your ransom was not paid in earthly currency, silver or gold; it was paid in the precious blood of Christ; no lamb was ever so pure, so spotless a victim. If only they would lend a more eager ear to the apostle of the Gentiles: 'A great price was paid to ransom you; glorify God by making your bodies the shrines of his presence.' Their upright lives would then be the shining example they ought to be; Christ's Church would far more effectively fulfill its mission to men. God wants all men to be saved, for he has willed that they should all be ransomed by the Blood of his only-begotten Son; he calls them all to be members of the one Mystical Body whose head is Christ. If only men would be more responsive to these promptings of his grace, how much the bonds of brotherly love among individuals and peoples and nations would be strengthened. Life in society would be so much more peaceable, so much worthier of God and the human nature created in his image and likeness."

O God, who by the Precious Blood of your Only Begotten Son have redeemed the whole world, preserve in us the work of your mercy, so that, ever honoring the mystery of our salvation, we may merit to obtain its fruits. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.


Parking, Entrance, and other Additional Information can be found on the backside of this sheet. Handicap parking will be available near door 2.
