The Virtue of Patience St. Joseph, Mirror of Patience

I would like to focus on one of St. Joseph's titles, Mirror of Patience. A mirror reflects the image in front of it. In St. Joseph, we clearly see the virtue of patience. Joseph's patience comes from his faith, love, and obedience to the Father. Our heart cries out for patience, as a mother, father, son, daughter, in the office, in school, in the car. We have a great gift in the life of St. Joseph. Go to Joseph, follow St. Joseph.

The life of St. Joseph reflects the virtue of patience. The patience of St. Joseph reflects how he endured the joys of life and the difficulties. St. Joseph listened and obeyed the angel of God to take Mary as his wife. Later, an angel spoke to Joseph and told him to flee to Egypt, and Joseph obeyed. Joseph's journey to Egypt was obedient and patient, not even knowing how long the journey was. Joseph's obedience gave him the patience to enjoy the beauty of the nativity and the willingness to suffer the unknown.

Joseph is a just man because he lives totally by faith. Even without words, he shows the depth of his faith. Joseph's faith reflects his love as a father and to the Father. He is willing to give his life totally to the Holy Family. As a father, Joseph would have been responsible for leading the Holy Family in their prayers. Joseph would have taught Jesus how to work with his hands and create things out of wood. We see patience in Joseph as Mary, pregnant with Our Lord, spends three months with Elizabeth. St. Joseph endured the joys and challenges of life with God's grace and faith focused on Our Lord. In doing so, St. Joseph saw that the joys and challenges of life are all worth it. WHAT IS CATECHETICAL SUNDAY?

In 1935, the Vatican published "On the Better Care and Promotion of Catechetical Education," a document that asks every country to acknowledge the importance of the Church's teaching ministry and to honor those who serve the Christian community as catechists.

Catechetical Sunday is a wonderful opportunity to reflect on the role that each person plays, by virtue of Baptism, in handing on the faith and being a witness to the Gospel. It is an opportunity for all to rededicate themselves to this mission as a community of faith.

WHAT DOES THE WORD "CATECHETICAL" MEAN?

The word might be more familiar than you think. Many Catholics have used the word "catechism" for years, and they know it has something to do with the Church's teachings. The root word, "catechesis," is from a Greek word meaning "to echo, or resound." Catechesis is the act of resounding or bringing the Church's teachings to the world.

WHAT IS A CATECHIST

A catechist is one who teaches in the name of the Church.

WHO ARE CALLED TO BE CATECHISTS?

Parents are truly the primary catechists of their children. They witness to their faith in their everyday lives, through their respect and love for one another. Parents also plant the first seeds of faith by exposing their children to the sacraments and the liturgy. On Catechetical Sunday, we not only highlight the work of catechists in parishes and schools, but we also commend parents and guardians and encourage them to take seriously their role of making their Catholic households a place where faith is passed on to the next generation.

WHY DO WE HAVE A SPECIAL DAY SET ASIDE TO COMMISSION CATECHISTS?

Catechesis is a distinct and special ministry in the Church. As the Catechism of the Catholic Church makes clear, "Catechesis is intimately bound up with the whole of the Church's life... her inner growth and

EVANGELICAL LOVE (EXCERPT FROM CATHOLIC NEWS SERVICE)

This past Sunday, September 10th, Pope Francis beatified an entire family of martyrs. Józef and Wiktoria Ulma and their seven children" were models of "evangelical love," Pope Francis said. The entire family was "exterminated by the Nazis on March 24, 1944, for sheltering some Jews who were being persecuted," the pope said. The Ulma family's eight guests -- Saul Goldman and his sons Baruch, Mechel, Joachim and Moses as well as Golda Grünfeld and her sister Lea Didner and young daughter Reshla -- were also executed.

Pope Francis told those gathered for the ceremony, that the Ulma family "countered the hatred and violence, which characterized that time, with evangelical love." He prayed that "this Polish family, which represented a ray of light in the darkness of World War II, would be for all of us a model to imitate in striving for goodness and in the service of those in need."

"And following their example, let us feel called to counter the force of weapons with that of charity, the rhetoric of violence with the tenacity of prayer.

The feast day chosen for the Ulma family is July 7, Józef and Wiktoria's wedding anniversary.
