Project Outdoor Nativity Scene (PONS)

Our local Knights of Columbus Council 9400 is one of 41 churches/ schools taking part in Project Outdoor Nativity Scene. The nativity scene was displayed after last weekend's Masses. Started in 2021, the goal of Project

Outdoor Nativity Scene was to showcase the true meaning of Christmas by having nativity sets adorn front yards in central Indiana making central Indiana the "Outdoor Nativity Scene Capital of the United States."

The nativity scenes are also a means of conversation and evangelizing. One customer spoke of the questions that come from some youth in the neighborhood. It was during Advent, and the youth saw Mary and Joseph kneeling, but no baby Jesus. The youth wanted to know where baby Jesus was. The neighbor explained that Jesus will be added on Christmas Eve, telling them that right now we are anticipating, we're waiting. The youth said they would return to see the Nativity scene on Christmas Day.

Jim Liston launched Project Outdoor Nativity Scene and says, "This is to remind people of what Christmas is truly about, to get back to the basics of what this season is all about - the simple presence of our Savior, Jesus Christ.

The simplicity of the Nativity scene says it all."

The Nativity scenes are made of PVC material that will withstand weather. Easy assembly is required. Checks may be made out to: Knights of Columbus Council 9400 in the amount of \$110.00 and can be ordered/ paid for after Masses or at the Pastorate office (Sacred Heart in Fowler).

Deadline for purchase is Sunday, Oct. 8 and delivery will be around Thanksgiving.





The Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary is October 7th.

The rosary is a wonderful prayer that helps us call to mind the great mysteries of our salvation. Venerable Pius XII in his *Encyclical on the Rosary*, called it a "compendium of the gospel." Its focus is on Jesus – the incarnation, ministry, crucifixion, and resurrection.

The rosary was the favorite prayer of St. John Paul II, who wrote an Apostolic Letter, *Rosarium Virginis Mariae* and encouraged all the faithful to pray the rosary as "a way of contemplating the face of Christ seeing him...with the eyes of Mary."

The rosary appeals to many. Perhaps, due to its simple repetition. Through the constant repetition of words, we may contemplate on the mysteries of God with the assurance that we are not alone. Mary and Jesus share our sorrows and joys. We grow in hope that we might one day share in the glory of Jesus and Mary forever.

The *Our Father* reminds us that God the Father is the creator and initiator of salvation.

The *Hail Mary* remind us to call upon Mary, our mother, when contemplating these mysteries. They also make us aware that Mary was and is intimately joined with her Son in all the mysteries of his earthly and heavenly existence.

The *Glory Be* remind us that God is the Alpha and the Omega, three-in-one, united in the mystery of the Trinity.

ROSARY BEGINNINGS

Catholics were not the first to pray with beads. The use of beads as an aid in prayer has a long history both in the Catholic Church and in other religions. The chain of beads establishes a framework, a setting, a pace for the prayer, and the repetition provides a background for meditation.

The English word **bead** is derived from an Old English word *bede* that means "prayer." The word **rosary** comes from the Latin *rosarius*, which means "garland" or "bouquet of flowers." It is an apt word for a bouquet of prayers offered to God. Tradition attributes St. Dominic (d.1221) to the formulation of the Rosary that is familiar to us today. Moved by a vision of Our Blessed Mother, St. Dominic used the Rosary to preach against heresy and help teach about Jesus, as the meditation on the mysteries developed a foundation of the truths of the faith. This saint also saw the prayer as an antidote to sin. As Dominic and his followers preached throughout Europe, they encouraged the laity to regularly pray the Rosary.

In 1571 Pope Pius V asked the faithful to pray the Rosary for Mary's intercession as a coalition of Catholic states faced off with the Turkish fleet during the Battle of Lepanto. The Catholic fleet was victorious; and the threat of Muslim forces was halted. To acknowledge the effectiveness of praying the Rosary and to thank the Blessed Mother for her intercession, Pope Pius V established the Feast of the Holy Rosary to be celebrated each




