# IN THE DEACON'S CORNER



Last month I challenged the readers of this article to begin [or hopefully continue] the practice of couple prayer. This habit not only helps couples to grow closer to each other, it helps them grow closer to Christ. It also helps to

strengthen the family, because prayer is a key ingredient to building a happy and holy marriage. This month, I'd like to suggest a focal point of your prayer – I'd ask that you specifically pray for the young people in our pastorate – to pray for the young people in our own homes - that they might consider a religious vocation as their future.

Earlier this month, we heard about 'Vocation Awareness Week'. Fr. Sean shared his own personal vocational call. He also made the appeal for all of us to pray for those who are called to hear and answer that call; to explore the possibility that the Holy Spirit may be calling them to become a Priest, a Deacon, a Brother, or a Sister. I'm suggesting that you go one step farther – make that prayer a bit more personal. It's one thing to pray for vocations from someone else's family – my suggestion is that we all pray that a religious vocation might come from our own families.

Sherie and I know a couple in Lafayette whose own son is a priest. The mother once shared with us that her first reaction to the news that her son wanted to become a priest was that she wouldn't have any grandchildren to help raise. What she later realized was that I, that you, and that we ALL are her grandchildren - by nature of our ALL addressing her son as Father. Instead of one or two or several grand-kiddos, she has been blessed with thousands of grandchildren

throughout the diocese – and across the Church. Here's yet another "five loaves and a couple fish" example of God, in His infinite goodness, taking a little and multiplying it beyond anything we could have imagined or done on our own.

Mindful of the family's role of "Domestic Church", this is the first place where children are introduced to and brought up in the faith of our doctrines. These conversations should be a natural part of our daily dialogues in our homes. We ALL want more Priests, more Deacons, more religious vocations to occur in our diocese. It's generally thought that these vocations come from 'somewhere else' – from someone else, but not from me... My challenge to you is to pray for and to encourage our young ones to be open to pursuing a religious vocation. The blessings of such a life are many, and its rewards are eternal.

# THE CATHOLIC CORNER HAVE YOU NOTICED?

The stores begin preparing for holidays weeks and months ahead. Halloween merchandise was out in August followed by Christmas merchandise on display the day after Halloween. Retailers are responding to the demands of the consumers.

Is our Advent merely a time for shopping? Or Do we wait in joyful hope for the coming of our Savior? What can help us to focus our hearts and minds on the two comings of Christ?

- Do we have an Advent Wreath (3 purple candles and 1 pink candle)?
- Is it the first decoration we set out or the last because it was forgotten?
- Is Christmas just a seasonal celebration about Santa and parties?
- Will our focus be on filling our hearts with prayer or on filling stockings?
- Will we take advantage of the Sacrament of Reconciliation?

### What is Advent?

Advent comes from the Latin root words "ad – venire" to come to. It is a time of preparation; a season of hope. We hope for the resurrection in the second coming of Christ as we celebrate the anniversary of the birth of the Christ-child.

"When the Church celebrates the liturgy of Advent each year, she makes present this ancient expectancy of the Messiah, for by sharing in the long preparation for the Savior's first coming, the faithful renew their ardent desire for his second coming."

In these four weeks of **preparation**, we are opening our hearts for Jesus to enter into our lives and through our actions here and now.

"Advent invites us to a commitment to vigilance, looking beyond ourselves, expanding our mind and heart in order to open ourselves up to the needs of people, of brothers and sisters, and to the desire for a new world." - Pope Francis When does it begin? How long does it last?

This year the first week of Advent begins on December 2/3 and lasts four weeks. The four Sundays of Advent each have a specific theme or focus: 1) HOPE Prophecy Candle – reminds us to remember the prophets (Isaiah) who foretold the coming of the Messiah; 2) /FAITH Bethlehem's Candle – reminds us of the strenuous journey of Mary and Joseph; 3) JOY Shephard's Candle – reminds us of the joy of the birth of Jesus; 4) PEACE Angel's Candle – reminds us of the message of the angles "Peace on Earth"

# What is the significance of the Advent Wreath?

The wreath itself is generally made from various evergreens signifying eternal life. The circle of the wreath has no beginning or end and symbolizes the eternity of God, the Alpha and the Omega.

Advent is also the beginning of the Church's liturgical year. The vestments worn are violet and rose. It may seem similar to Lent, for it too, is a time of repentance intermingled with hope in the joy of Christmas. Be sure to take advantage of the various penance services throughout the pastorate during the season.


