Filtering the World's Hatred

Let's get real: we humans (and even us Christians!) are really terrible at loving our enemies. The very definition of "enemy" means someone we don't love. How are we supposed to love our enemies? How are we supposed to follow Jesus on His command from today's Gospel?

Here's an image that might help. Like Jesus, we are to become like water filters. Jesus on the cross took the world's hatred that was given Him. But, rather than pass it on by condemning His persecutors and enemies, Jesus absorbed their hatred. Like a water purifier, he absorbed all that was given Him and transformed it - absorbing evil, transforming it, and then giving back to the whole world His redeeming love.

Think of that the next time someone attacks you, hurts you, treats you unfairly. To begin to love our enemies, the first step is to simply absorb their hatred. Don't return anger for anger, hatred for hatred, unfairness for unfairness. Absorb it. This is the first step.

Absorb it and you begin to follow Jesus. You begin what is required to love your enemies.

Celebrating the Lord's Day ***Keeping Sunday—All Day*** ***(Part 1)***

Celebrating the Sunday Eucharist—though central and essential—does not complete our observance of Sunday. In addition to attending Mass each Sunday, we should also refrain "from those activities which impede the worship of God and disturb the joy proper to the day of the Lord or the necessary relaxation of mind and body" (*Compendium of the Catechism of the Catholic Church*, no. 453). Sunday has traditionally been a day of rest. However, the concept of a day of rest may seem odd in a world that runs 24/7m where businesses run as normal no matter what the day of the week, and where silence seems to be an endangered species. By taking a day each week to rest in the Lord, we provide a living example to the culture that all time belong to God and that people are more important than things. As Pope John Paul II said in *Dies Domini* (The Day of the Lord), his apostolic letter on Sunday:

Through Sunday rest, daily concerns and tasks can find their proper perspective: the material things about which we worry give way to spiritual values; in a moment of encounter and less pressured exchange, we see the true face of the people with whom we live. Even the beauties of nature—too often marred by the desire to exploit, which turns against man himself—can be rediscovered and enjoyed to the full. (*Dies Domini*, no.67)

Key Principles of Catholic Social Teaching ***Participation***

All people have a right to participate in the economic, political and cultural life of society. It is a fundamental demand of justice and requirement for human dignity that all people be assured a minimum level of participation in the community. Conversely, it is wrong for a person or a group to be excluded unfairly or to be unable to participate in society. In the words of the U. S. bishops, "The ultimate injustice is for a person or group to be treated actively or abandoned passively as if they were non-members of the human race. To treat people this way is effectively to say they simply do not count as human beings."
