John's Version of a Beatitude Speech

There are no beatitudes in John, so today's Gospel stands out as THE one and only criterion for discipleship. Ironically, we hear "the Golden Rule" so often we hardly pay attention to it nowadays. The Golden Rule is so incorporated into our societal mindset that atheist are as likely as Christians to share this moral as the one they try to live by.

Unfortunately, hardly any of us Christians or not, does a very good job of actually loving others. Every day, all the time, in big ways and small. (Know that I am not talking about allowing oneself to continue to be abused.) More unsettling, we Christians are commanded to do this not only for family and friends, but for people we vehemently dislike, even for enemies.

This is why this gospel is proclaimed today, during Eastertime. The only chance we have of actually living out the Golden Rule is by following Jesus....to the cross, to the tomb, to new life. Follow Jesus and the world sees something qualitatively different than someone who is "trying to be a good person."
