Sarx and the Bread of Life

Today I invite us Catholic Christians to stop using the Real Presence to feel superior to other Christians. Yes, today's Gospel is clear that we must eat Jesus' flesh to share in Jesus' life. But, Jesus used the word "sarx" when he could have used the word "soma." And that makes all the difference in terms of what the Real Presence means.

You see, sarx is a derogatory, negative term. Sarx refers to flesh that get sick and oozes pus and other nasty liquids. Sarx refers to impurity, to imperfection, to weakness and limitation. To death. It does not refer to something perfect and pure. If Jesus intended this more positive meaning, he would have used the word soma. But, he did not.

By eating Jesus' flesh, we consume and then allow Jesus to transform all that we view as imperfect in the world. Ourselves included. Eating Jesus' flesh is humbling, a more "lowly" act in many ways than washing feet. Yes, it sets us apart from those who do not consume Jesus' flesh.. But, superior? That's not what Jesus intended.

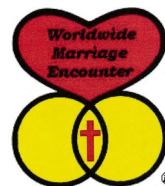
