Living Catholic in the 808: Exercises in Evangelization By: Kristina M. DeNeve **Evangelization Coordinator** Diocese of Honolulu

We are living in a world of tumultuous change, leading to a dramatic shift in cultural values and a broad spectrum of moral issues. These are challenging days, taking place right in our homes, workplaces, and communities. There is your truth and my truth: there can be no such thing as absolute truth.

In fact, Oxford Dictionaries had selected "POST - TRUTH" as the 2016 International Word of the year. According to the definition, it is an adjective "relating to or denoting circumstances in which objective, facts are less influential in shaping public—opinion than appeals to emotion and personal belief."

Evangelization must fit into this worldviews!

Take heart that the early Christians faced the same challenges. They experienced what we are experiencing. As with them, we too can persevere to share the Good News of salvation. In 2 Tim 4:1-5, Paul wrote "proclaim the word; be persistent whether it is convenient or in convenient; convince, reprimand, encourage through all patience and teaching. For the time will come when people will not tolerate sound doctrine but, following their own desires and insatiable curiosity, will accumulate teachers and will stop listening to the truth will be diverted to myths."

Over the coming weeks, we'll dig deeper into evangelizing in this "post-truth" world.
