**Living Catholic in the 808:
Sharing Your Faith Story in Three Easy Steps**

Bishop Robert Barron, in his book "Vibrant Paradoxes: The Both/And of Catholicism", highlights evangelical lessons, as found in Luke 24:13-35.

Two disciples were going to a 7-mile journey to Emmaus, from Jerusalem. Jerusalem is the locale of the Last Supper and the Crucifixion. They were walking away, looking downcast. The story ended with the two disciples going back in haste to Jerusalem, their hearts burning within themselves. What caused their transformation?

Here are three lessons offered us by Bishop Barron:

1. The successful evangelists do not stand aloof from the experience of people, praying for them from a distance. On the contrary, the evangelists join them and deign to walk in their shoes and feel the texture of their experience
2. The successful evangelists use the Scripture in order to disclose the Divine pattern
3. The successful evangelists are persons of the Eucharist. They are immersed in the Mass; practice Eucharistic Adoration; draw the evangelized to a participation in the Body and Blood of Jesus. They know that bringing people to Jesus Christ is primarily a matter of seeing the broken heart of God through the broken bread of the Eucharist.

Youth gathered to share a meal and then headed over "pumped" for a fantastic keynote and concert of relationships and trusting God's guidance to live the life He meant for you.

She shared her personal testimony of her love relationship journeys from just before her Confirmation to her life now. Thinking the young man she waited for was the one, then to learn in trusting God the whole way that it was not His plan. And how her beautiful journey led her to her husband and family.

One of her messages to the youth based on the theme;
Daily pray for 3 things:

Modesty
Chastity
Selflessness

The clinically tested techniques are for any couple—from the nearly engaged to the long-time partners—who want to solve problems or prevent them from happening. It's for people who want to improve their marital communications.

CPREP emphasizes strategies under two crucial frameworks: strategies geared toward lowering risk factors and strategies for raising protective factors to help marriages succeed. This powerful approach is designed for premarital or marital couples, whether distressed or non-distressed.

- A biblical model of marriage, intimacy, and barriers to oneness.
- An overview of factors shown to predict marriage quality, distress, and divorce.
- Communication skills that help couples handle conflict constructively.
- Problem solving skills that work.
- A model for helping couples to forgive.
- A cognitive framework for helping couples understand the impact of expectations.
- A framework for understanding, building, and maintaining commitment.
- Approaches for helping couples maintain the special blessings of marriage: friendship, fun, intimacy.
- A discussion of the mystery of spirituality and ways couples can attain spiritual oneness in Christian marriage.
