

POPE URGES BELIEVERS TO BE HOLY IN EVERYDAY LIFE

Pope Francis urged Christians to live their lives with love and to bear witness to Christ in everything they do.

He said one of the most mature fruits that is borne from our communion with Christ is our commitment to show charity towards our neighbor, and to love our brothers and sisters with self-sacrifice, just as Jesus loved us.

Pope Francis explained that the charity of a true believer is not the result of strategies; it does not arise from external solicitations, from social or ideological demands, but from the encounter with Jesus and from "remaining" in Jesus.

"For us, he is the vine from which we absorb the sap, that is, the "life" that we bring into society: a different way of living and spending, which puts the last in the first place" he said.

The Pope held up the example of the Saints but encouraged those present to pursue holiness in their everyday lives.

"To be holy does not require being a bishop, a priest or a religious. We are all called to be holy by living our lives with love and by bearing witness in everything we do, wherever we find ourselves" he said.

The Pope concluded saying that every activity - work and rest, family and social life, the exercise of political, cultural and economic responsibilities - if lived in union with Jesus and with an attitude of love and service, is an opportunity to live baptism and evangelical holiness to the full.

REMAIN IN MY LOVE!

Jesus taught His disciples to always draw their hearts and minds to His commands. As witnessed by His way of life and love, He set a model for all those who would follow Him to live the same. All throughout Jesus' ministry, He stressed the word LOVE. He did not only say this, but manifested it in His Passion, Death and Resurrection. It was because He experienced the love that the Father had for Him and Him to the Father. And that Jesus shared this love to His disciples. For His disciples to have this kind of love, He said, "Remain in My Love."

Jesus' words were not only meant for His disciples then. His words are meant for us now. He commands us to remain in His love to be able to bring about goodness into our life, our families, our communities and our world. This is why the Son of God came into the world to bring us back to the goodness of God, who is LOVE itself. But it shouldn't be the sentimental kind of love. One who would not even prioritize himself or herself for the sake of the other but rather, a love that demands faithfulness regardless of anything, a love that demands totality and wholeness of being that calls one to immense



sacrifice for the other just as Jesus did.


It is so interesting that last week, we heard Jesus telling His disciples to "remain in Him." Now, we hear Him say, "remain in My love." The word "remain" connotes not just a physical presence but deeper than what it means, that is to accept, to embrace, to receive and to be in the mind and heart of Him, who loves unconditionally, Jesus. Jesus manifested this kind of love not only by word but exemplified it when He endured the pain and agony for our sins. He paid the price for our offenses and truly giving up Himself for us, His beloved. That is, He remains in His love for us.

LITURGICAL CATECHESIS

Dear Johan,

Growing up I was told that it was a sin not to attend Mass on Sunday. And what about holy days of obligation? Do we still believe in all this?

Gentle Reader-

When you love someone, do you see it as an obligation to spend time with him or her? Or, would the person who has been saved from drowning ever think it a burden to thank his or her savior?


Although yours is a fair question, it also bespeaks a legalistic and minimalist approach to the celebration of the mysteries of our faith, which is rather regrettable and supremely sad. Would that there were no need for an obligation, at least not the kind that is imposed on us by the church, today.

Our current understanding of Sunday and holy days of obligation is that it has been imposed on us by the church, and rightfully so. By contrast, the early church had no such law because there simply was no need for it. The sense of "obligation" early Christians felt to celebrate Sunday Eucharist flowed from a deep personal and communal desire. Theirs was an inner obligation to the celebration of the Eucharist. They were so moved by the mystery of God's love for us that they simply could not but celebrate. Saint John Paul II in his apostolic letter *Dies Domini, On Keeping the Lord's Day Holy*, from 1998 calls it the "obligation of conscience."

As this "obligation of conscience" or inner desire started to wane, individual bishops found it necessary to remind the faithful that the Sunday assembly was not simply an option but rather a sacred duty. This kind of language can be found in local church documents dating back to the fourth century. Though the number and intensity of these documents increases over the centuries, it was not until 1917 when the Code of Canon Law defined the obligation to celebrate Eucharist on Sundays and holy days of obligation as universal law. This law was upheld by the 1983 Code of Canon Law. And the current Catechism of the Catholic Church identifies the deliberate failure to follow this obligation as a grave sin.

So, yes, we still abide by Sunday and holy day obligations. Both your question and my answer make me sad, though. On the one hand, I am saddened that we have punishing legislation in an attempt to encourage people to celebrate Sunday Eucharist. On the other hand, I am saddened by the fact that we have lost this sense of inner obligation. We might be better off if we were less legalistic and more spiritual when it comes to the celebration of the Eucharist. But maybe that is merely a liturgical reverie or fantasy?

The flock that Jesus loves is so vast that he wanted other shepherds after his own heart to help him tend the flock and to lay down their lives in this combat with Satan so that others could live in Jesus. And this is why God has chosen us and immersed us in the waters of his love. This is why he anoints us with the Holy Spirit, which makes us as bold as Peter. He, too, was attacked by Satan when he denied Jesus three times, but he repented and in today's reading we see him boldly preaching to the very people who put Jesus to death under the influence of that worst of all wolves. We, too, are often attacked by Satan and we fall prey to lust, to selfishness, to violence, and to sin. But when we repent, the Spirit fills us to make us bold in confronting the wolf wherever we find him. Then – miracle of miracles – the Lamb of God offers himself to us as food and drink in the Eucharist – so that his flesh can strengthen our flesh and his blood make us boil with the zeal of the Good Shepherd.

RITE of CHRISTIAN INITIATION for ADULTS (RCIA): Please contact the Parish Office if you are a baptized Christian of another denomination wishing to become Catholic, or if you wish to receive the Sacraments of Initiation.

SACRAMENT of MATRIMONY: Please contact the Parish Office at least 6 months in advance for an appointment with a priest. This appointment should take place before any other arrangements are made.
