POPE FRANCIS INVITES ALL FAITHFUL TO PRAY ROSARY IN OCTOBER

The Weapon Against the 'Great Accuser'

Pope Francis has invited all the faithful of all the world to pray a Holy Rosary daily during the entire Marian month October.

The Holy Father wants all to join in communion and in penitence, as the people of God, in asking the Holy Mother of God and Saint Michael Archangel to protect the Church from the devil, who always seeks to separate us from God and from each other.

In recent days, before his departure for the Baltic States, the Holy Father met with Fr. Frédéric Fornos, S.J., International director of the World Network of Prayer for the Pope, and asked him to spread this appeal to all the faithful throughout the world, inviting them to conclude the recitation of the Rosary with the ancient invocation "Sub Tuum Praesidium", and with the prayer to Saint Michael Archangel that he protect us and help us in the struggle against evil (cf. Revelation 12, 7-12).

The prayer, citing the first book of Job is the weapon against the Great Accuser who "goes around the world seeking to accuse." Only prayer can defeat him. The invocation "Sub Tuum Praesidium" is recited as follows:

We fly to Thy protection, O Holy Mother of God.

Do not despise our petitions in our necessities, but deliver us always from all dangers, O Glorious and Blessed Virgin.

With this request for intercession the Holy Father asks the faithful of all the world to pray that the Holy Mother of God place the Church beneath her protective mantle: to preserve her from the attacks by the devil, the great accuser, and at the same time to make her more aware of the faults, the errors and the abuses committed in the present and in the past, and committed to combating without any hesitation, so that evil may not prevail.

The Holy Father has also asked that the recitation of the Holy Rosary during the month of October conclude with the prayer written by Leo XIII:

Saint Michael Archangel, defend us in battle, be our protection against the wickedness and snares of the devil; may God rebuke him, we humbly pray; and do thou, O Prince of the heavenly host, by the power of God, cast into hell Satan and all the evil spirits who prowl through the world seeking the ruin of souls. Amen.



Papal Intention for October: Evangelization – The Mission of Religious

That consecrated religious men and women may bestir themselves, and be present among the poor, the marginalized, and those who have no voice.



“And the two of them shall become one flesh.”

“The verse quoted above from our First Reading this 27th Sunday of Ordinary Time presents the original plan of God about the union of man and woman, certainly called Marriage. It is validated by the teachings of Jesus in the Gospel. He makes it clear the indissolubility of marriage when He says that what God has joined together, no human being must separate. In Marriage, God unites man and woman in an unbreakable bond of loving intimacy and togetherness.

One of the highlights of Pope Francis’ apostolic journey to the United States in 2015 was the World Meeting of Families. He recognized the value of families and posed an inspiration to us as a nation and the whole world what it takes to bring up a family. He had this to say,

“Before He created the world, God was in love, because God is love. The love He had within himself, the love between the Father and the Son, in the Holy Spirit, was so great, so overflowing – I’m not sure if this is theologically precise, but you will get what I am saying – that love was so great that God could not be selfish. He had to go out from himself, in order to have someone to love outside of Himself. So, God created the world. God made this wonderful world in which we live and which, since we are not too smart, we are now in the process of destroying. But the most beautiful thing God made – so the Bible tells us – was the family. He created man and woman. And He gave them everything. He entrusted the world to them: “Grow, multiply, cultivate the earth, make it bear fruit, let it grow”. All the love He put into that marvelous creation, He entrusted to a family.” (Address of the Holy Father at the B. Franklin Parkway, Philadelphia on September 26, 2015)

Marriage has to be seen in the light of what God intended to be in the beginning and in the light of the dignity of the human person. It entails commitment, fidelity, truthfulness, respect and unity. It is knitted in love, strengthened by it and nourished by it.

It is also worthy to note that this month is called Respect Life Month. Every aspect of human life starts from a wonderful loving relationship between spouses knit by God’s blessings, that is in the Sacrament of Matrimony. At the moment that spouses make their vows expressing themselves to be faithful to one another in good times and in bad, in sickness and in health, to love and cherish until death do them part, it empowers them to journey in life and faith with God, with one another and with their children.

There are many attempts today to change the view on marriage. But Christian tradition maintains its position based on the teachings of Christ and not based on human understanding and acceptance of marriage. This Sunday’s readings invite us to ask ourselves and our society and to look for ways to strengthen and value Marriage and the Christian family.

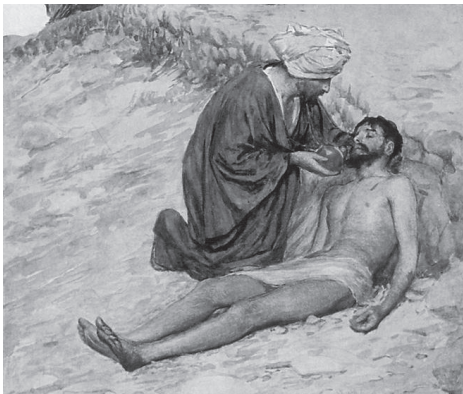

LIFELONG CATECHESIS

On July 7, 1827, the first Catholic missionaries arrived in Honolulu harbor on the French ship, *La Comete*. Three priests and three lay brothers of the congregation disembarked in Honolulu on that day. Their reception into the islands was not as they expected. A few years earlier, Rives served King Kamehameha II and Queen Kamamalu as secretary and interpreter on a trip to England. While away from the Kingdom of Hawai'i, the royal couple contracted a form of measles that resulted in their demise. Instead of accompanying the royal bodies back to the islands, Rives went off to France.

This act of Rives that was perceived by Queen Kaahumanu, King Kamehameha II's mother and the kingdom's Queen Regent, as disrespectful and ungratefulness for all the years of royal patronage. Upon arrival of the French ship carrying the six missionaries, reports indicate that Queen Kaahumanu ordered the ship's captain to turn around "with the Sacred Hearts personnel on board, but he left without them, and they quietly started their mission without too much interference."

The presence of protestant missionaries who had just arrived a few years earlier did not help in the welcoming of these Catholic missionaries to Hawai'i. Although the goal of winning souls for Christ was the same for both, the protestant missionaries were not happy to find these priests in the Lord's vineyard. According to historian

Maggie Bunson, "they considered the French priests as competitors and erroneously called them Jesuits, as many other priests in America were called Jesuits in those times."

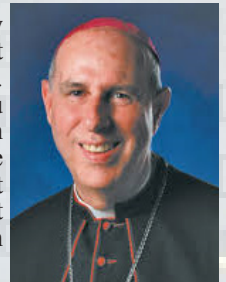
Like the Jesuits in the French missions of North America, the Picpus Fathers learnt the language and customs of the natives to help in the task of evangelizing. To establish the mission in the kingdom, they used the strategy of blending in within the Hawaiian culture. As much as possible these missionaries stayed within their Catholic compound and entertained any local visitor that would wander in. In that way, they were able to learn the traditions of the Hawaiians.

All this time the Governor of Oahu, Governor Boki, was able to put off any resistance of the kingdom to the Catholic mission. But on April 2, 1831, with a new Governor ruling- Governor Kuakini, Queen Kaahumanu summoned Fathers Bachelot and Short to an assembly of chiefs. There they were given the official notice of banishment from the kingdom. Father Bachelot "at first saluted the Chiefs courteously, but refused to accept the notice or even contemplate banishment, upbraiding them and arguing his case openly." But the Queen and the Chiefs were able to get the priests out of the kingdom in December of that same year. This was the official beginning of the anti-Catholic persecutions in Hawai'i. BISHOP LARRY SILVA

Put on a happy face! That seems to be a popular theme for the world we live in today. Is something going very wrong in your life? Just smile it away! Do you have a terminal illness that you are afraid to suffer through? Put on a party for your family and closest friends and take a pill to put yourself out of your misery – at least in this world. Do you have an unexpected pregnancy that will ruin your budding career or just cost you too much money? You know you can legally dispose of that child and go on living free and easy without him or her. Do you have a pain in your heart that is very heavy? Take drugs or alcohol to cover it over so that no one will suspect. Has a loved one died, and you are overcome with grief? Put on a celebration of life, and allow no crying but only laughs and light hearted stories. Is your marriage becoming just too difficult? Don't bother yourself with trying to work things out or with confronting destructive communications patterns or habits, just walk away and start over. Is your Church beset with scandals and corruption? Just go find another church – or not!

Of course I am not recommending any of these supposed solutions to real problems. We might be able to put on a happy face for a while, but ultimately the problem will come back to plague us even more fiercely. Pretending that we are not grieving when someone dies deprives us of reflecting on how much love we shared with the person, and how much it hurts that the relationship cannot continue in the same way. Walking away from one difficult marriage with the same problems that led to its storminess is not going to assure success in a new marriage. Wishing the scandals in the Church would just disappear as old news is not going to bring about the reform that is needed so that the Church can be purified. Escaping the pain of life by anesthetizing oneself with drugs or alcohol is only going to compound the problems and will never really solve them.
