On Dec. 8th we celebrated the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception. Whose conception was it? This question is often answered wrong. This feast is not about the conception of Jesus, though connected, but of the conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary. In 1854, Pope Pius IX definitively pronounced as the church's dogma that "in the first instance of her (Mary's) conception, by a singular privilege and grace granted by God, in view of the merits of Jesus Christ, the Savior of the human race, was preserved exempt from all stain of original sin."

Unlike all human beings, original sin was excluded from her soul and the state of original sanctity, innocence, and justice was conferred upon her by God. While simultaneously excluded from having personal sin, she was not made exempt from the temporal punishments of our first parents-Adam and Eve. Those of which are sorrow, bodily infirmities, and death. Jesus is the new Adam and Mary is the new Eve. She is the exemplar of being a disciple of the Lord and the first Saint who enjoys the fullness of Divine Life. Our Lady, the Immaculate Conception, pray for us!

POPE: ADVENT A TIME TO MAKE PEACE IN THE SOUL, FAMILY, NEIGHBORHOOD

Pope Francis is urging Christians to prepare themselves for Christmas this Advent season by being humble and trying to build peace in their soul, in their family and in the world.

Advent, therefore, is the time to prepare ourselves for this Prince of Peace by being at peace with ourselves, our soul, that is often in anxiety, anguish and without hope. For this, one needs to start with oneself.

After being at peace with our soul, it is time to be at peace at home, in the family, the Pope said. He noted much sadness in families with much struggle, "small wars" and at times disunity.

The Pope then spoke about making peace in the world where there is much war, disunity, hatred and

exploitation. Christians should ask themselves what they are doing about creating peace in the world by working for peace in the neighborhood, in the school and in the workplace.

The Pope said that whenever there is the possibility of a "small war" at home, in the heart, at school or at work, we should stop short and try and make peace. "Never, never wound the other. Never," he said, exhorting

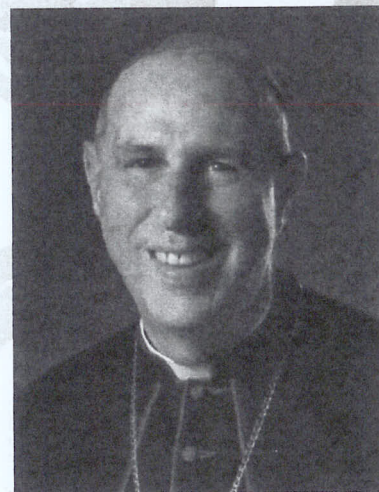
Christians to start by not speaking ill of others or firing the first cannon. This way, he said, we become men and women of peace, carrying peace forward.



The Church, interestingly enough, begins this beautiful season of Advent on a different note. Instead of light-hearted fun, it focuses on the calamities that will come at the end of the world. "There will be signs in the sun, the moon, and the stars, and on earth nations will be in dismay, perplexed by the roaring of the sea and the waves. Just a few days ago I spoke to my staff about what we should do if an active shooter should come into one of our churches – something that has been happening all too frequently. And then there is the sex abuse crisis, which has shaken our Church like an earthquake. We do not have to rely on the Scriptures to paint a picture of frightening circumstances. They are right before our eyes.

But we who believe in Jesus are told, in the very midst of all these trials and tribulations and frightening phenomena, to hold up our heads high and stand firm, because our redemption is near at hand – a redemption that will last forever.

This is Jesus' way of reminding us that we simply cannot save ourselves from the catastrophes that are upon us or from those that may yet come. In fact, we have managed fairly well to bring many of these catastrophes upon ourselves. We can easily be caught off our guard, becoming drowsy, carousing about how much we can accomplish, and becoming drunk on pride over our own achievements. We need not look at the sun, the moon, and the stars to see frightening things happening in our schools, where there is bullying and such competition that many youths have given up on life. But neither do we need to drink ourselves into a stupor or distract ourselves so that we do not experience the pain of seeing so much suffering. Instead, we celebrate the fact that we do have a Savior, who has come to us and who will come again. He is a Savior who does not run away from anything – even things as frightening as the cross. And it is to prepare the way for this Savior in our hearts and in our world that we follow his command to refuse to let the frightening follies of the world overcome us; that we raise our heads high so that we will receive the strength to escape the tribulations and to bring others with us to the place of rest in this simple, humble Savior, Jesus our Lord.

AVIATION MUSEUM TOUR

Our tour guide, Mr. Mike, explained about the planes used during the attack on Pearl Harbor. The Japanese fighter planes called zeros could only travel about five hundred miles. There was no way that they would be able to make it to Hawaii, carry out their plan, and fly back to the home base. Because of that, the Japanese used aircraft carriers and extra boats that held only fuel. On the way to Hawaii, they would fill up their ships by attaching a tube from the extra boat to the aircraft carrier.

After Pearl Harbor was bombed, President Franklin Delano Roosevelt was furious. He gave his friend, who was a B-25 pilot, orders to fly to Japan and drop an atomic bomb on Hiroshima and Nagasaki. In order to make that journey, the U.S. unloaded all unnecessary cargo. In the back of the plane, there were extra guns to shoot anybody that would be on their trail. To reduce the weight, President Roosevelt told the pilots to take out the guns and add two broomsticks painted black into its place. It gave Japanese enemies the illusion that they were carrying guns. I thought that was the most interesting part of the tour. I would have never thought the military would use broomsticks as props in World War 2.



• In 1903, the Wright brothers built the first plane ever, and they flew the plane around the world.

• At the museum, it had a flight lab for students to learn about planes.

• All the flight systems included a screen, instrument key, keyboard, throttle, and a wheel stick although the keyboard wasn't used as often as the other tools.

• The instrument key has 7 keys that tell the information of the plane which contains the speed in knots, altimeter, artificial indicator, compass, RPM, Gear Up and Down, and Radar Scope.

Mr. Tony first taught us the pages for speed, directions, height and elevation.

• His number one rule was to not touch anything unless he says to.

• I also learned how to start the engine, and I learned that when landing the plane, you have to turn off the engine and engine the wheel brake as fast as possible.

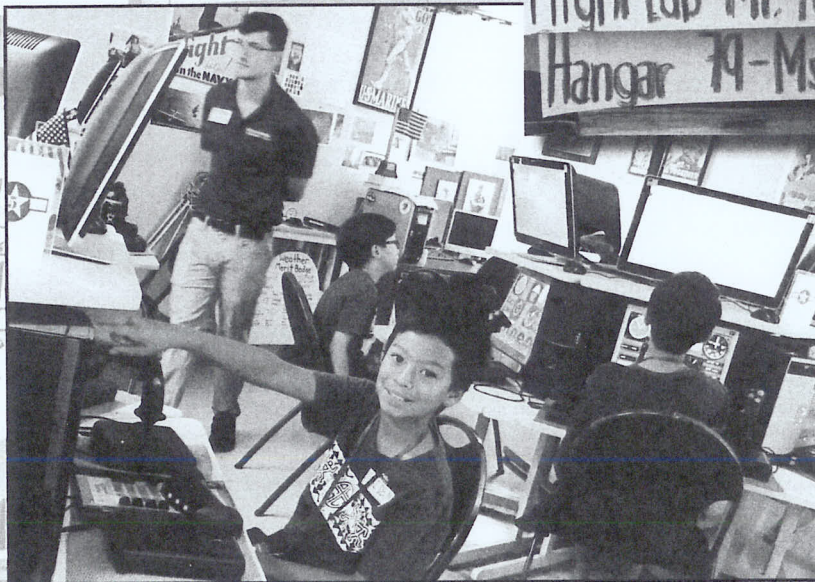
• Mr. Tony told us that some men quit miles.

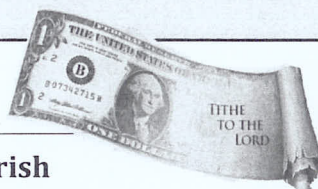


GOOD SAMARITAN STEWARDSHIP MOMENT

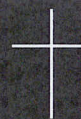
