## CONFUSED ABOUT LIFE? LISTEN TO THE GOOD SHEPHERD, POPE FRANCIS ADVISES

Pope Francis advised listening to and speaking with Christ the Good Shepherd in prayer, so that one can be guided on the right paths of life.

"Listening to and recognizing Jesus' voice implies intimacy with him, which is consolidated in prayer, in the meeting heart to heart with the divine Master and Shepherd of our souls," he said May 12.

"This intimacy with Jesus, this being open, talking with Jesus, strengthens in us the desire to follow him," the pope continued, "to come out of the labyrinth of wrong paths, to abandon selfish behaviors, to set out on the new paths of fraternity and the gift of ourselves, in imitation of Him."




Pope Francis reminded people that Jesus is the only Shepherd who speaks to us, knows us, gives us eternal life and keeps us. "We are his flock and we must only strive to listen to his voice, while with love he scrutinizes the sincerity of our hearts," he said.

"And from this continuous intimacy with our Shepherd comes the joy of following him, allowing us to lead to the fullness of eternal life. Jesus the Good Shepherd welcomes and loves, not only one's strengths, but one's faults," he said.

The Good Shepherd -- Jesus -- is attentive to each of us, seeks us and loves us, addressing his word to us, knowing our heart, our desires and our hopes, as well as our failures and disappointments.

Shepherds are very important for many reasons, but one of them is that they can see the big picture that the sheep may not be able to see for themselves. If the sheep are in a place where they have eaten up all the grass and drunk all the water available, do they know where they should go for more food and water? They would probably just think there is no more in the world and wither away and die. But the shepherd scouts out the surroundings and knows that just over that ridge or just across this dry stream, there is more food and water for the sheep. He sees what the sheep cannot see, and so he leads them along the right path. They may wonder why his is leading them one way, when another might look more promising to them, but the shepherd knows better. So it is the Jesus, the Good Shepherd, who sees the big picture of our lives and knows what will nourish us best.

Perhaps Jesus sees that some of you will be mothers or fathers yourselves one day, and if you listen to his voice, he will prepare you to be good husbands and wives and good parents. Perhaps Jesus sees that some of you are called to be priests, or religious Sisters or Brothers. You can resist and go your own way -- as I did many times -- but the Good Shepherd will always draw you back to what he knows is the right path for you, sometimes having you following willingly, but sometimes prodding you and pulling you to go the right way. The beautiful thing is that this Good Shepherd is no longer a distant voice from far away. Today, you will receive him into your hearts, so that he himself will be your food and drink. He will come into you physically to embrace and kiss and love you, so that you can better hear his voice and follow the way he wants you to go.


# MIDDLE SCHOOL SERVICE PROJECT

On Tuesday May 7, 2019 the sixth, seventh, and eighth grade class of OLGC went on a field trip to Maunalua Bay. Departing sharply at 8:30 AM students, parents, and teachers took the long bus ride down to the south shore where they gathered by the bay with community leaders from the non-profit Mālama Maunalua.

Before entering the water, students listened to presentations regarding the cultural and historical significance of the bay and learned that its fishpond was productive enough to feed the entire population of Oahu at the time. Students also discussed the impact plastic pollution has on marine life and took up a challenge to reduce their plastic footprint by using metal straws which they received as gifts. Lastly students were coached on how to identify three of the most common types of invasive seaweed and learned which characteristics, like high reproductive capacity or lack of competition, allow invasive organisms to thrive.

Finally, after a long trek up the beach, everyone was able to put into practice what they learned and the group collected a whopping 740+ pounds of seaweed. Far from going to waste the seaweed is to be dried and composted for use as a productive fertilizer in our community. Malama ike kai!



## THE COMMUNION of SAINTS



### ST. MARIANNE COPE

**Born:** January 23, 1838, Heppenheim, Germany

**Died:** August 9, 1918

**Feastday:** January 23

**Beatified:** May 14, 2005 by Pope Benedict XVI

**Canonized:** October 21, 2012 by Pope Benedict XVI

**Patron of:** Lepers, outcasts, those with HIV/AIDS

A year after her birth, her family emigrated to the United States, settling in Utica, New York. She attended school until eight grade. Her father became an invalid and she went to work in a factory to support her family. After her father died she became a novitiate of the Sisters of the Third Order Regular of St. Francis in Syracuse, New York. German speaking immigrants settled in New York, so she became a teacher and later a principal at a school for immigrant children. She helped direct the opening of the first two Catholic hospitals in central New York. In 1883, Mother Marianne became the Superior General of her congregation. At this time, she received a plea for help for leper patients in Hawaii. King Kalakaua sent her a letter asking for aid in treating patients in Molokai. The King was declined by more than 50 other religious institutes.

Mother Marianne left Syracuse with six sisters and managed a hospital on Oahu to attend to victims of leprosy. After a year, she helped establish the Malulani Hospital on Maui.

In November 1888, Mother Marianne moved to Kalaupapa and cared for the dying Fr. Damien. When Fr. Damien died, she officially took charge for the care of the boys of Kalaupapa.

Despite all her years working with the lepers, she never contracted leprosy. Mother Marianne Mother Marianne died of natural causes. She was buried on the grounds of the Bishop Home. In 2005, her remains were brought to Syracuse for reinterment at her mother house. In 2014, her remains were returned to Honolulu and enshrined at the Cathedral of the Basilica of Our Lady of Peace.


