From the Rector

February 1st, 2015



On Wednesday of this past week, the Parish Pastoral Council unanimously recommended approval of our 2015-2018 Pastoral Plan. This plan is the product of the listening sessions and surveys which gave parishioners an opportunity to offer input on parish life. The Pastoral Plan will now serve as our guide for the next four years. The Plan has been posted to the website and copies are available at the doors to the Cathedral.

One of the consistent complaints we heard from parishioners during the planning process was the lack of adequate parking. I am therefore pleased to announce a pilot program which may solve this problem. Beginning next weekend, parishioners will be able to park free of charge in the Parking West parking garage located immediately behind O'Connor Hall during the following Masses: 4:00 pm (Saturday Vigil), 9:00 am, and 11:00 am. Please note:

- Obtain a numbered parking pass from one of the ushers after Mass this weekend.
- Enter the Parking West garage using the Sprague entrance ONLY.
- Parking is available during the 4:00 pm (Sat.), 9:00 am, and 11:00 am Masses ONLY.
- You may park in reserved spaces EXCEPT those reserved for Cathedral Plaza.
- Parking is available during Mass and up to 45 minutes after Mass.

There are 100 spaces available for parishioners to use during the three busiest Masses of the weekend. The cost to the parish budget will be \$100 per Mass (\$300 per weekend) and we will evaluate this parking option after a few months to see if it is working.

Your cooperation and participation is needed to help make this a success. If you are able to walk a few extra steps and do not need to use an elevator, please pass up street parking and use the Parking West garage. The more regular parishioners we have using the garage, the more spaces will be available to visitors, potential parishioners, and those who have mobility issues.

If you are able to help alleviate our parking problem, obtain a pass from one of the ushers this weekend and plan on parking in the Parking West garage next weekend. Let's hope this will be a positive solution to a long standing problem.

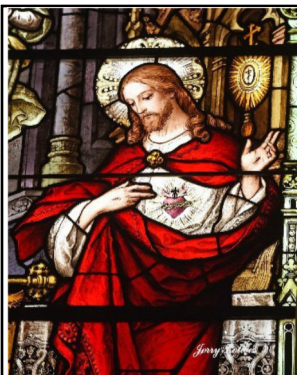

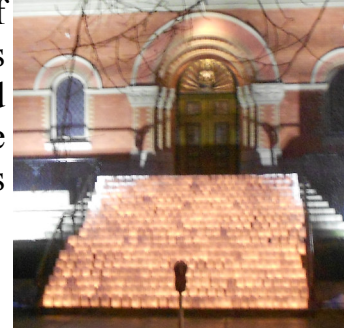
