# From the Rector

## February 8th, 2015



Next weekend we will observe “Commitment Sunday” for the 2015 Annual Catholic Appeal. Commitment Sunday is the time when parishioners are asked to make their pledge to the appeal. The Annual Catholic Appeal is the principal funding source for the Diocese of Spokane. As Catholics, we know that each and every one of us are members of the Church and called by God to do our part in building up the Body of Christ. Our strength is found in what we accomplish together.

This year presents a challenge in that we are currently without a bishop. However, we at the Cathedral Parish still have a leadership role to play in the liturgical and pastoral life of the Diocese of Spokane. The 75 parish communities of Eastern Washington should be able to look to the Mother Church as a model for how a parish community pulls together for efforts such as the Annual Catholic Appeal

Our Annual Catholic Appeal goal for this year is \$116,562. My hope is to have as many Cathedral households respond as possible – even if that means returning the pledge card with the offering of one dollar or the commitment of “prayers”. The reality is that some families are able to make a significant financial pledge and others are not. All of us, however, can respond in some fashion as a sign of our solidarity with one another.

This week the Diocese will be mailing out ACA information as well as pledge envelopes. Please fill out the envelope and return it next Sunday along with the regular collection. Be sure to write “Cathedral” on the envelope so that your gift is credited toward our parish. I truly hope that we can make our goal within a couple of weeks which would demonstrate our leadership role in the Diocese and allow us to move on to other pastoral initiatives in the parish.



# Scriptural Reflection

February 8, 2015 — Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Jb 7: 1-4, 6-7; Ps 147: 1-6; 1 Cor 9: 16-19, 22-23; Mk 1: 29-39



“Rising very early before dawn, he left and went off to a deserted place, where he prayed.”

There are scores of instances in the Four Gospels which indicate Jesus praying. He often would go off alone to pray, but He also prayed with others publicly; He prayed before He made a choice, before He healed someone, and He was just as likely to pray after as well.

St. Paul exhorts us to “pray constantly, never ceasing.” Jesus perhaps more than any other fulfilled this admonition. He provides to us the perfect example of both how we should pray and in what ways. Prayer is at the foundation of our faith; it is at the core of a stewardship way of life. Developing an ongoing, consistent, and active prayer life is paramount for each of us.

Prayer not only indicates our constant awareness of God, but it enhances our lives, and is an indication of our total trust in God. Trust in God is also an important facet of stewardship. Knowing that we are in God’s hands and in His care is what strengthens us and allows us to make the commitment Jesus has asked us to make. One of Jesus’ final prayers is one which offers us the suggestion of how we need to approach life: “Father, into thy hands I commend my spirit.”



## Parking Garage

If possible, please pass up street parking and avoid double parking by using the Parking West garage just behind O’Connor Hall. Take note of the following:

- You must have a parking pass which can be obtained from the Parish Office. If you are unable to come to the office during regular business hours, call Carolyn at 358-4290 and she will mail you one.
- Parking is available during the 4 pm (Sat.), 9 am, and 11 am Masses ONLY.
- Enter the Parking West garage using the Sprague entrance ONLY.
- You may park in reserved spaces EXCEPT those reserved for the Cathedral Plaza.
- Parking is available during Mass and only up to 45 minutes after Mass.
- Please consider increasing your tithes a bit to help offset the expense to our parish.

By using the garage, you will be helping to make the Cathedral a more accessible and welcoming place for our visitors, potential parishioners, and those with mobility issues. Thank you!
