One of the strategies contained in our new Pastoral Plan is to continue to improve parish communications through the use of technology. Two weeks ago, the Parish Pastoral Council listened to a presentation on a communication tool called "Flocknote". Flocknote is a software program specifically created for churches and community organizations to help them efficiently communicate with members.

To put it simply, Flocknote makes use of texts and emails which are immediate forms of communication and often read in a timely manner. So, for example, if a Holy Day of Obligation fell on a Friday, we could send out a text and or email on Thursday evening to every member of the parish reminding them of Mass times. Or, if the Grotto Youth Group meeting needed to be cancelled because of snowy weather, a last minute text and or email could be sent out to the teens of the parish. We are really excited about the ways in which this new tool will help us to better communicate and build community.

Next weekend, we will be offering a very brief presentation on Flocknote at the end of each Mass. Please bring your smart phones to Mass (or your less than smart phones) as you will have the opportunity to opt in to this new form of parish communication. If you don't want to wait until next weekend, go ahead and sign up in advance by simply logging on to Flocknote.com/SpokaneCathedral.



Scriptural Reflection

March 15, 2015 – Fourth Sunday of Lent

2 Chr 36: 14-16, 19-23; Ps 137: 1-6; Eph 2: 4-10; Jn 3: 14-21



It has been said many times over and in a variety of ways that stewardship is based upon gratitude. Gratitude for what, we might ask? For the variety of blessings each of us receives, understanding full well that each of us is gifted in different ways and perhaps even in different measures. However, there is one gift in which we all share equally.

“For God so loved the world that he gave his only son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life.” (John 3:16) It is difficult for us to even conceive of the magnitude of that multifaceted gift, from God’s unconditional love for us to the extraordinary gift of his son

Jesus to the fabulous gift of everlasting life.

Stewardship calls us to appreciate all of God’s gifts, but if we only focus on the gifts listed above, our gratitude should know no bounds. Pope Francis has said, “God never gives someone a gift they are not capable of receiving. We all have the ability to understand and receive God’s gifts.” We need to recognize God’s gifts and especially during our preparations for Easter, find ways to show and live out our gratitude.
