

This week marks the beginning of new pastoral assignments for priests throughout the Diocese of Spokane. Wednesday, July 1st is the start date and therefore many priests will be loading and unloading books, boxes, and personal items on Monday and Tuesday. I am glad this doesn't apply to me!

Although I am staying put, we will nonetheless see some priest staffing changes here at the Cathedral. I want to take this opportunity to thank Father Vincent VanDao for his ministry this past year. In addition to taking care of the Vietnamese community, Father Vincent assisted us with daily Masses, confessions and sick calls. Fr. Vincent was very faithful to his assigned duties and I will miss his presence around the campus. Father has been assigned to St. Mary Parish in the Spokane Valley.

Father Curtis Seidel was ordained last year and has now been assigned to our parish. He comes to the Cathedral from St. Mary Parish (he and Fr. Vincent have switched places) and will join Father Jason Hiner as a second Parochial Vicar. Father Seidel's responsibilities will include leading the Young Adult Group, assisting with the Youth Group, and serving as an on-call chaplain for the Spokane Police Department (he has a badge and everything!). As with me and Father Jason, you will see Father Seidel in the regular rotation for Mass and confessions.

Please join me in thanking Father Vincent as well as giving a warm welcome to Father Curtis Seidel.


Postures at Mass





Scriptural Reflection

June 28, 2015 – Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Wis 1: 13-15; 2: 23-24; Ps 30: 2, 4, 5-6, 11-13; 2 Cor 8: 7, 9, 13-15; Mk 5: 21-43



In today's Second Reading, St. Paul quotes Exodus 16:18: "Whoever had much did not have more, and whoever had little did not have less." On the surface this may seem confusing, but it bears a strong stewardship message for us.

One of the challenges of our society is the tendency to gather and to keep and to measure our success by possessions. Jesus told us over and over in a variety of ways that "possessions" are a major stumbling block in our journey toward holiness.

Stewardship was once defined by a bishop as:

1. Following faithfully
2. Living responsibly
3. Sharing gratefully
4. Possessing loosely

This, in a nutshell, is what it means to be a good steward.

That is the message from St. Paul, as well. As difficult as it may be for us, we need to focus on others in service more than we should try to glorify ourselves through what we may seem to have. In particular we need to focus on the "possess loosely" aspect. That is more than material items, of course. We have a tendency to "hang on" to traditions, people, and other things that we view as "ours." Pope Francis cautions us, "A heart occupied with the desire to possess is a heart full of this desire, but without God."
