## From the Rector September 13th, 2015



The reality of our Cathedral Family is that parishioners live all over Spokane County and many have to drive a fair distance to attend Mass and engage in parish life. Unlike a parish in the suburbs, we do not have a strictly neighborhood parish which means we have to work a little harder at building community. For some time now I have discussed with the Parish Staff and the Parish Pastoral Council the idea of creating what I am calling “Cathedral Communities.” A Cathedral Community would be a grouping of parishioners according to zip code or close proximity to one another.

So, for example, we could have the Cathedral Community of Airway Heights, or the Cathedral Community of the Spokane Valley, or the Cathedral Community of Eagle Ridge. Parishioners living in those neighborhoods would be encouraged to gather just once a month for 90 minutes of fellowship, structured prayer/bible study/catechesis, and a meal.

I am pleased to announce that we have completed the initial planning for the creation of Cathedral Communities. Father Hiner is taking the organizational lead while being assisted by Father Seidel. Households are being grouped together and we will be seeking parishioners to serve as coordinators of individual Cathedral Communities. Please watch the bulletin and pay attention to Flocknote for upcoming information.

It is obviously not required that every member of the Cathedral Parish become a member of a Cathedral Community. It is totally voluntary. However, it seems to me that this kind of small group Catholic fellowship can go a long way to strengthening our relationships and building up our faith.





# Scriptural Reflection

September 13, 2015 — Twenty-fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time  
Is 50: 5-9A; Ps 114: 1-6, 8-9; Jas 2: 14-18; Mk 8: 27-35



“Demonstrate your faith to me without works, and I will demonstrate my faith to you from my works.” (James 2: 18) In our Second Reading from the Letter of James we are challenged to have a living faith, a faith backed up by action. This is a concept which has been debated ever since Jesus invited us to be His disciples. Is our faith enough to save us, or must we do more? James certainly thinks we need to do more.

James is making reference to something termed by most theologians as “living faith.” That kind of faith is exemplified by being an active participant in building the Kingdom. It is more than attending Mass and praying.

It is the kind of faith to which we are called through stewardship. Our faith communities, our parishes, are filled with ministries and ways that we can serve and reach out to those in need. Perhaps we need to find a way to be involved in something, anything, to be an active member of our communities, a focused and participating steward.

God knows who and what we are. For some of us prayer and a complete trusting faith is most likely enough. However, James is trying to let us know that if we can, we need to look for more. We need to find ways to live out our faith as stewards of our many gifts.
