





From the Rector October 4th, 2015



As we begin the month of October, it is good to remind ourselves that this is the month which the Church dedicates to the Most Holy Rosary. This is primarily due to the fact that the liturgical feast of Our Lady of the Rosary is celebrated annually on October 7th. For us at the Cathedral, October 7th is observed as a Solemnity because it is the anniversary of our dedication as the Mother Church of the diocese. The noon Mass this coming Wednesday will be a bit more solemn, therefore, as we commemorate this dedication.

Setting aside an entire month to focus our attention on the Holy Rosary is a great way to honor the Blessed Virgin Mary and demonstrate our gratitude to her for the protection that she gives the Church. As a priest friend of mine says, the Holy Rosary is the “nuclear weapon” of the spiritual life.

Tradition tells us that the Rosary as a form of prayer was given to Saint Dominic (1170- 1221) by the Mother of Our Lord, who entrusted it to him as an aid in St. Dominic’s conflicts with heretics. The Dominican pope, St. Pius V, did much to further the spread of the Rosary and it thereafter became one of the most popular devotions throughout the Church.

During my treatment for cancer, I know that many of you are praying the Rosary for my complete healing. I cannot tell you how much that means to me. This past week my chemotherapy pump was disconnected and I finished my final round of radiation therapy. My medical team is calling me a “superstar” patient for having so few negative side effects. I give the credit to your thousands of prayers and the intercession of our Blessed Mother – particularly under the title of Our Lady of Lourdes. The residual influence of the chemo and radiation will continue to degrade and kill the tumor for about another 10 days and then I will rest up and prepare for surgery. I will keep you posted but please continue to keep me in your prayers for a full and complete recovery.

Scriptural Reflection

October 4, 2015 — Twenty-seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time
Gn 2: 18-24; Ps 128: 1-6; Heb 2: 9-11; Mk 10: 2-16



Proper stewardship can be defined and measured in a variety of ways. In today's Gospel from Mark, when Jesus notes that His followers are trying to prevent children from "bothering" Him, He states, "Let the children come to me; do not prevent them, for the kingdom of God belongs to such as these." There are two lessons for us in this passage.

The first reminds us of our responsibility as stewards for the children of our faith community. The primary duty for raising and forming children in the faith is, of course, the parents. However, each of us who is baptized into the community and is a vital part of the Body of Christ shares in stewarding these little ones.

A second lesson has to do with Jesus telling us "...whoever does not accept the kingdom of God like a child will not enter it." Small children, infants in particular, are largely helpless. They need us. Jesus' point to us is that we need the Lord. Children understand their dependence. Nevertheless, we sometimes balk at the thought that we are totally dependent upon God. If we reach that conclusion, and if we put our lives into God's Hands, like a child, we are more likely to "inherit the kingdom." Jesus is telling us to trust Him, and that will help us to be the stewards and disciples we are expected to be.
