SIXTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

From the Rector

May 1, 2016



Last Saturday morning I called 911 to report two young people yelling and physically fighting across the street from the Cathedral. A couple hours later a man was screaming obscenities and shaking his fist at the façade of the building – he was obviously struggling with mental illness, intoxication, or a mixture of both. These two incidences are a reminder that being located within the downtown core often means interacting with people who are afflicted with poverty, addiction, and/or a variety of psychological difficulties.

Given these circumstances, it is a violation of common sense to allow the sale of marijuana in our neighborhood. Selling drugs in the shadow of our Cathedral simply cannot contribute to the safety and well-being of people living, working, and worshipping downtown.

I am very grateful to Senator Mike Baumgartner who has called a hearing regarding this matter on May 12th from 9:00 a.m. until 11:00 a.m. at Spokane City Hall Council Chambers located at 808 W. Spokane Falls Boulevard. The senator is introducing legislation authorizing local governments to prohibit the operation of licensed marijuana retail businesses within alcohol impact areas (which is where the Cathedral is located).

I will be testifying at the hearing and I strongly encourage parishioners to attend if possible. I realize this is a work day and thus may be too difficult for many to be present. If that is the case, I suggest contacting Senator Baumgartner's office to lend your support for his efforts. The senator's contact information is printed in today's bulletin.

Thank you for your consideration and I pray that our efforts will bear fruit in making our neighborhood safer and more respectful of human dignity.



Scriptural Reflection

May 1, 2016 — Sixth Sunday of Easter
Acts 15: 1-2, 22-29; Ps 67: 2-3, 5-6, 8; Rev 21: 10-14, 22-23; Jn 14: 23-29



Our Gospel Reading from John 14 recounts what Jesus says to His disciples as He prepares to leave them. Specifically the Lord says, “Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. Not as the world gives do I give it to you.” You may be aware that in Jesus’ time (as well as in many parts of the world today) the common greeting was Shalom. That means, of course, “peace.” It is nonetheless not only a greeting but it is also what people said when they parted.

Jesus makes a point of making it clear to His followers and to us that He is not just saying “Peace” the way people usually do, but from Him it is filled with more strength and meaning. It is “Not as the world gives” that Jesus is saying “Peace be with you.” Jesus is telling us that He through the Holy Spirit will always be with us, stand next to us, and strengthen us. That is something we must believe. Trusting in the Lord is a key aspect of stewardship.

In our world we are more likely to say “Good-bye” than “Shalom.” However, even that has a meaning with a much deeper message. “Good-bye” derives from the farewell “God be with you” or “God be with ye.” Thus, when we say “good-bye” we are also giving someone the same message that Jesus gives us. God is with us — always. He loves you.

Are you concerned about marijuana shops going in downtown?

Senator Baumgartner is introducing legislation to exclude them from neighborhoods like ours that are designated as “high alcohol impact areas.” One cannot buy fortified wine in our neighborhood and thus one should not be able to legally purchase drugs either. Please let the Senator know about your concerns and he will forward your responses to the Liquor and Cannabis Board as well as the City of Spokane.
