From the Rector

July 3, 2016



Many of you have no doubt seen the extensive media coverage of an incident which took place on our campus one week ago. A young man entered the Cathedral following the 7:00 a.m. Saturday morning Mass and caused a fair amount of damage to the processional cross, votive lights, and high altar. He lit candles, moved furniture and ended up strapping a large knife blade to the back of the corpus on the processional cross. He carried the cross to the front steps of the Cathedral and then proceeded to yell at people passing by for Hoopfest. The police responded quickly and arrested him.

The Parish Pastoral Council met on Wednesday to discuss security on our campus. The tension we face is locking up the building outside of Mass times vs. having the doors unlocked which offers hospitality to tourists, visitors from other parishes, and our own parishioners wanting to stop in and pray. The general sense of our Parish Council discussion led us to the conclusion that it would be a shame to shut off the beauty of our Cathedral to the public. We want to try some intermediate steps first before locking the doors.

Therefore, at the Parish Council's recommendation, we will be immediately consulting law enforcement and asking for a review of our current security measures (alarms, cameras, staffing, etc.) so as to improve our security protocol. Until that review is finished we have hired a security guard to physically be present on the campus – especially on weekends when Mass is not being offered and the presence of Cathedral Staff is limited. The doors will remain unlocked and guarded until our professional security review is complete. Based on those recommendations, we will implement a more permanent plan which takes into account our need to protect people and property while keeping the Cathedral open and welcoming to all.



Scriptural Reflection

July 3, 2016 — Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time
Is 66: 10-14C; Ps 66: 1-7, 16, 20; Gal 6: 14-18; Lk 10: 1-12, 17-20



If you are over 65 years old, you probably remember Archbishop Fulton Sheen. Venerable Fulton Sheen was an American bishop who became known for his preaching and especially his work on television and radio. In fact, in the 1950s into the 1960s, he may have been the most recognizable Catholic in the United States.

Sheen once said, “Show me your hands. Do they have scars from giving? Show me your feet. Are they wounded in service? Show me your heart. Have you left a place for divine love?” In many ways that statement parallels something St. Paul writes in our Second Reading from his letter to the Galatians: “From now on, let no one make troubles for me; for I bear the marks of Jesus on my body.” St. Paul is saying the same thing as Archbishop Sheen — that is, “Do our lives reflect the presence of the Lord? Are we living as good stewards, as disciples, such that we, too, bear the marks of Jesus?”

We are not speaking of real scars, but we are talking about how the Lord has called us to follow Him, has asked us to take up the cross and follow Him as a matter of fact. If we strive to give, to serve, and to have faith as Sheen indicates, then we, too can rejoice as the Lord says to us, “Your names are written in heaven.” We are called, and we need to respond to that call.

A Note of Solidarity

Our Lady of Lourdes Cathedral in downtown Spokane was vandalized on Saturday, June 25, 2016. We at the Spokane County Human Rights Task Force are saddened and angered that yet another house of worship in the Spokane area has been vandalized.

Little is known about the perpetrator or his motives and it is unknown if the Cathedral was specifically targeted as a hate crime or as a matter of opportunity. In either case, we stand in solidarity with the Catholic Diocese to deplore all acts of violence and vandalism upon our houses of worship, businesses, homes, or institutions.

The Spokane County Human Rights Task Force is committed to work for the elimination of prejudice and discrimination. We encourage the citizens of our region to stay vigilant and to expand efforts to reach out and get to know their neighbors. It is through knowledge, understanding and compassion that we mitigate the occurrence of these types of crime in our community.
