Christians Need to Vote Pro-Life: Christians have a duty to inform themselves about where the political candidates stand on the issues. This evaluation starts, of course, with where they stand on violence against human beings, because if public servants cannot tell the difference between serving the public and killing the public, they do not belong in public office. What if a candidate supported terrorism? Would a God-fearing Christian say, "Well, I disagree with you on terrorism, but what's your health care plan? Maybe we can work together on some social programs. After all, terrorism is not the only issue." The parallel, of course, is abortion. "Typically, the skull is brought out in fragments rather than as a unified piece" (Baby-killer Martin Haskell, in 1999 Court testimony in Wisconsin, regarding legal abortion). How can anyone make the case that this skull-cracking, which is still legal, is less violent than terrorism? How can anyone make the case that we can tolerate it while we work with the candidate on "social" programs? The heart of what is "social" is that it respects the other person ---- and that means not cracking their skull. We fight terrorism, and rightly so. But when we allow abortion and vote for pro-abortion politicians at the same time, the evil we fight becomes merely a reflection of the evil we do. - Pro-Life Articles

Message from Deacon Randy Jaeckels

Do you remember your baptism? If you are a cradle Catholic, you probably do not. What about your Confirmation, do you have memories of that day? Confirmation, following Baptism and Eucharist, form the Sacraments of Initiation in the Catholic faith. Through Confirmation, the baptized person is "sealed with the gift of the Holy Spirit" and is strengthened for service to the Body of Christ. The Holy Spirit can touch our lives in many ways. For some, the Holy Spirit appears in a soft, gentle manner like the dove at the Baptism of Jesus. For others, the Holy Spirit can impact lives like the loud noise the Apostles experienced at Pentecost. How is the Holy Spirit reaching out to you?

On Sunday, November 6, seven young adults from our two parishes will receive the Sacrament of Confirmation. Bishop Ricken (or possibly Fr. As these young adults prepare to receive this special gift from God, I invite all of us to be more open to allow the Holy Spirit to be a part of our lives and let the Holy Spirit work within and through us.
