One special way to bring about transformation in our lives is to undertake the Divine Mercy Novena, which begins each year on Good Friday. Message from Deacon Randy Jaeckels

Alleluia, Alleluia! He is risen!

This past week, the holiest week of the year, we experienced a spiritual roller coaster ride. On Palm Sunday, Jesus receives a glorious welcome as he arrives in Jerusalem. He is hailed as the new king. We begin the Pascal Triduum with Holy Thursday and the Last Supper. Jesus washes the feet of the Apostles as he makes a point of the importance of serving others, and then he presents the Apostles (and us) with the gift of the Eucharist as he shares the Passover meal with them. He then goes to the garden of Gethsemane for prayer in preparation for his Passion. On Good Friday, we hear of Jesus' suffering and crucifixion. But we also hear of his love for others and his mercy before he dies. Holy Saturday provides much of the beauty of our faith. We experience new light, the history of our faith, the importance of water and the Holy Spirit, and receive Eucharist.

On Easter, God's promise to us is fulfilled in the resurrection of Jesus. He conquers sin. There is victory over death and our salvation is provided in Jesus' desire to comply with his Father's will. We are all given the gift of new life! We can be filled with hope and joy with what awaits us at the end of our lives.
