## RESPECT LIFE

#### From the Grapevine by Deacon Randy J

For the first time in many years, my wife and I decided to plant a small garden. After some discussion, we chose the vegetables to place in the garden. After a trip to the greenhouse, we put the plants and seeds into the ground. With the lack of rainfall this year my wife has been diligently watering and fertilizing the garden. The plants are growing, and we have already enjoyed some of the fruits of her labor.

Jesus often spoke in parables. We hear the parable of the sower and the seed this weekend and the explanation of the parable that Jesus offers the Apostles. Our hearts and minds and souls must be like the good soil described in the parable. All three must be in alignment to accept the word of God. There may be times when our heart or soul receives the word, but our mind struggles with what we accept. So, we must nurture the word (seek to understand it) so we can act upon the will of God to bear good fruit.

The word of God is not always easy to understand. That is why in this gospel message Jesus stresses the importance of understanding the word. As part of Bishop Ricken's Pastoral Letter last fall, he is asking us to practice Lectio Divina to understand God's word. Through Lectio Divina process, we are asked to read a scripture passage, meditate on it, pray about it, and determine what the passage is saying to you.

I encourage you to try the Lectio Divina process. Let the word of God be planted in you, nurture it and then allow it to grow through your actions. May your spiritual production be abundant!
