He (Jesus) said to them, "But who do you say that I am?" Simon Peter said in reply, "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God." Matthew 16:15-16

From the Grapevine by Deacon Randy J

In this weekend's gospel, we hear Peter boldly profess his faith. Jesus asks his apostles, "But who do you say that I am?" And Peter replies, "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God." As Jesus continues to speak, he informs Peter that he will be given the keys of the kingdom of heaven. In this gospel passage Jesus speaks of Peter's primacy in the Church and that of Peter's successors.

But I think that Jesus may also be posing something interesting for us to ponder from this gospel passage. In speaking of ourselves, we may want to ask the question, "Who do others say that I am?" or simply, "Who am I?". This may be a wonderful opportunity to take a deep dive and look into ourselves. How do others see me? Is my faith strong? Do I set a good example for my family, friends, and those in my community?

At the end of our lives there is a good chance that we will be asked by Jesus and St. Peter to give an account of ourselves and the life that we have lived in order to get into the heavenly kingdom. It may suit us well to conduct a self-evaluation periodically while here on earth to prepare ourselves for the encounter we may have after we leave this earthly life.
