Learning on the Journey: Tuesday, October 17 at 6:00pm at Holy Family Parish Learning Center in Brillion. Join us for a series of adult theology courses offered by the Theology Department of Roncalli High School. Choose between 3 discussions:

"But Like Bread That is Baked": That Body of the Lord and a Martyr's Death "The Martyrdom of St. Polycarp" is among the most remarkable martyrdom texts in Church history. We will explore Polycarp's story to understand how our early ancestors in the faith understood dying for the faith in Eucharistic terms. The Eucharist: Our Source of Life, Death & Resurrection: The Eucharist is often described as our "food for the journey" and rightly so! However, the Eucharist is also our participation in the life, death and resurrection of Christ. We will explore this reality through the eyes of St. Ignatius of Antioch, as well as the effects the Eucharist has on our own spiritual lives. MANITOWOC NEEDS YOU! Between 2017 & 2021, abortions were performed on 300 Manitowoc County mothers in the state of Wisconsin according to 2021 Reported Induced Abortions In WI released June 2022 by the Department of Health Services, the most recent report available. Effective June 24, 2022, abortion became illegal in Wisconsin. Yet, on September 18, 2023 Planned Parenthood resumed performing abortions in Mi-Iwaukee and Dane County. Also, it is uncertain how many Wisconsin residents may now be successfully procuring "abortion pills" via mail from states where abortion is now legal. It is impossible to know how many very early abortions occur with the use of "morning after pills" available over-the-counter. Since 2014, Manitowoc Prayerful Walkers have led our county to embrace a culture of life along with church respect life groups throughout our county and the presence of The Crossing. 40 Days for Life continues through Sunday, November 5, 2022.
