From the Grapevine by Deacon Randy J

The motto of the Boy Scouts is "Be Prepared". Robert Baden-Powell, founder of the Boy Scouts, wrote that to be prepared meant, "You are always in a state of readiness in mind and body to do your duty." These words could also be used as a good summary for this weekend's gospel. Jesus tells the parable to his disciples of the ten virgins who await the bridegroom for the wedding feast. Five were prepared with enough oil for their lamps, while the other five did not bring flasks of extra oil while they waited.

Jesus instructs the disciples at the end of the parable, "Therefore, stay awake, for you know neither the day nor the hour." Like the five wise virgins preparing for the coming of the bridegroom, we must be prepared for the coming of Jesus Christ at the end of time. We are making a big mistake if we assume that through Christ's death and resurrection, we are assured a spot in the Heavenly Kingdom. We must live our lives in such a manner that we show Jesus that we are worthy to join him in heaven. It is our responsibility to keep our spiritual lamp burning. We must keep the light of Christ that we received at our baptism burning brightly.

I think by now we know the expectations of preparedness for everlasting life. We need to follow the commandments, beatitudes, and the teachings of Jesus. We must use the gifts and fruits of the Holy Spirit. We must fully practice our faith with zeal.

So, be prepared, and you will be ready for that time, whenever the day or hour God comes calling!
