Dan Miller, CEO of Pro Life Wisconsin, has shared his story of his possible non-existence when, long before abortion became legalized in the USA, his grandmother, at that time a scared unwed teenager, was being prepped for an abortion on a doctor's table in Sheboygan, a few counties from her home, when she suddenly decided she could not go through with it. The child she bore was Dan's father! Her family never knew this until she decided to share it with her granddaughter shortly before she died. If you can, take a few minutes and calculate how many people you love would not have been created with their unique DNA, personalities, gifts, and talents, had YOUR grandparent been aborted by YOUR great-grandparent!
