It is very easy for us to be judgmental. At times we make snap decisions, and we may not have been correct in our assessment. When I was in high school, I passed judgment on an upperclassman based on a couple of observations that I made while at school. A few months after making my judgment, which was negative, I found myself working with this person. Within a month of working with this person and getting to know the individual, I found out I had made an incorrect assessment. The person was terrific; we became friends. From this lesson, I have tried to refrain from passing judgment on individuals, although this can be difficult at times.

In this weekend's gospel, Jesus tells his disciples a parable and within it he asks the question, "Why do you notice the splinter in your brother's eye, but do not perceive the wooden beam in your own?". He then goes on to say that we should remove the wooden beam from our eye first to see clearly in order to remove the splinter in our brother's eye.

Jesus tells us that when it comes to being critical, we should look in the mirror. In refraining from passing judgment on others, perhaps it would be good to evaluate ourselves and how we live our lives. In a few days we will enter the season of Lent. During Lent, we might consider examining our consciences to see how we can make improvements within ourselves. Through prayer and repentance, may the Holy Spirit guide us in making appropriate changes in our lives so we may be dedicated to our faith. Then, when it comes time for our final judgment, we will be filled with joy to hear our Lord say to us, come and join me in the Heavenly Kingdom, my faithful servant!
