FROM THE DESK OF

In the sea of sacrifices during Lent each year, the Church gives us a sort of island in the Solemnity of Saint Joseph. Since he is one of our most important secondary patrons, Saint Joseph and his feast day warrant a real celebration here on campus: we will honor him with an All-School Mass, Eucharistic procession, and spaghetti lunch for the entire campus. This year, we also invite the grandparents of our students to join that celebration.



At the end of 2020, Pope Francis gave us an Apostolic Letter on the 150th anniversary of the proclamation of Saint Joseph as Patron of the Universal Church. I find myself returning to this letter, titled *Patris Corde* ("With a Father's Heart"), each year at this time of year to reflect on the gift of Saint Joseph in my own life. Among the personal reflections on a saint he calls an "extraordinary figure, so close to our own human experience," Pope Francis exhorts: "Each of us can discover in Joseph—the man who goes unnoticed, a daily, discreet and hidden presence—an intercessor, a support and a guide in times of trouble. Saint Joseph reminds us that those who appear hidden or in the shadows can play an incomparable role in the history of salvation."

This year, I have been drawn in a particular way to recall the witness of my maternal grandfather, one of the many "Saint Josephs" in the history of my own salvation. I can't

help but think of him when I see an image of Saint Joseph the Worker with his carpentry tools, since my earliest memories of actual woodworking involve my grandfather shaping a pinewood derby car that was not only fast, but also beautiful for me as a Cub Scout. What could have been a simple task to get through to earn a badge instead was a moment of real connection for me because of his quiet service. For better or worse, I have inherited his attention to detail (ask any of the prefects who have built dance decorations with me). I'm grateful that while he was alive, I was able to express my gratitude for his intercession, support, and guidance. I pray that our feast day celebration this year may be a time of real connection for the grandparents who are able to join us.

In the weeks leading up to his feast day, let us pray along with Pope Francis the prayer that ends his Apostolic Letter: "We need only ask Saint Joseph for the grace of graces: our conversion."

Hail, Guardian of the Redeemer, Spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary. To you God entrusted his only Son; in you Mary placed her trust; with you Christ became man. Blessed Joseph, to us too, show yourself a father and guide us in the path of life. Obtain for us grace, mercy and courage, and defend us from every evil. Amen.

Refreshments and time to visit with students will immediately follow the Eucharistic Procession. Grandparents of all grades may attend!


PARENT/TEACHER CONFERENCES & NOON DISMISSAL
