### PILGRIMAGE WEEK

Our Upper School Pilgrimage Program is an approach to student formation that is unique to JPG. It can be a stretch to plan for (and fund) a weeklong formation program for all 160 of our middle and high school students, so why do we do it? What makes spending a week outside the classroom worthwhile, and why do we call it pilgrimage? A pilgrimage is a journey to a sacred destination, undertaken as penance or in pursuit of a more profound conversion. This practice is deeply rooted in Judeo-Christian history. The faithful have always gone on pilgrimages because the difficulties of the journey convert our hearts and call us to become more vibrant witnesses of our faith.



Pilgrimage has also always been an integral part of Upper School student life at JPG. Inspired by John Paul II, who as a priest and professor used to take young people kayaking and camping in order to teach them about the Faith in a relaxed setting, we bring students outside the classroom to have powerful, personal encounters with Jesus. Since JPG's founding, we have been committed to bringing students to Washington, D.C. each January to visit the National Basilica of the Immaculate Conception and participate in the March for Life. In 2014, we inaugurated the Junior Pilgrimage to Rome when Mr. Fletcher and I accompanied a dozen juniors to the canonization of our patron on Divine Mercy Sunday. After the success of that trip, pilgrimages for the other grades were added in the years that followed. This summer, we launched the Alumni Pilgrimage Program with a hiking trip, and we are planning a Rome trip and mission trip for alumni in future years.



This year, 7th and 8th graders participated in retreats, field trips, and outdoor excursions that focused on the themes of friendship with Christ and with one another. Freshmen were introduced to JPII's Theology of the Body teachings at a four-day retreat and then tasked with sharing their faith as they led a 5th and 6th grade retreat at JPG. The sophomore class sought the face of Jesus in those in need as they volunteered in work projects in the Houma-Thibodaux area and visited the Seelos Shrine in New Orleans.

Our juniors traveled to Italy to visit ancient ruins like the Roman Forum, to admire priceless works of art like the Sistine Chapel, and to pray at the tombs of saints like JPII, Francis of Assisi, Peter, and Cecilia. On this year's pilgrimage, I was particularly moved by our visit to the private rooms and chapel of St. Ignatius of Loyola. My devotion to

this saint has grown over the past year after making a weeklong silent retreat with his Spiritual Exercises and reading his extensive collection of letters last Christmas. To see the chapel where Ignatius prayed, the desk where he wrote many of his letters, and the place where he died was unbelievably special.

Finally, in their culminating pilgrimage experience, our seniors returned to the Rocky Mountains of Colorado where they experienced the breathtaking beauty of God's creation while testing their physical and emotional limits. They took turns in pairs leading the day's hike and supported their peers as they followed the voice of Christ "to the heights."

Please join me in continuing to pray that their experiences of pilgrimage will bear fruit in the hearts of our faculty and students. Pope St. John Paul the Great, pray for us! Cmily C. Byers




