

There was no author listed and it was not beautifully decorated. It just hung there on the wall, anonymous and boring in beige and white. Yet, my eyes kept drifting back to it.

This is the beginning of anything you want. Can I begin something without first asking what do I want or rather, what does God want for me? In one of my

readings this summer, I was challenged to think about whether I was complacently seeking those things that kept me comfortable or did I search out that which was hard but would allow me to grow? Did I seek to be a better version of myself everyday or just remain where I am because here is not so bad? I hoped that I sought discomfort and the better version of myself where this growth would be measured not in perfection but rather by my level of contribution and commitment. Could I too be a better version of myself as a parent and as a leader? Was I seeking the same? To all

of these questions, I prayed for a resounding, "YES!"



Even with a sure yes, I know that I cannot do this alone. (Mt 18:18-20, Ec 4:11) As members of this community, we need to inspire and motivate each other to grow and to become better. When we reflect, we should consider: How are we as parents becoming better versions of ourselves? How are we as parents providing a better culture for our children?

This summer did we run, play, read, talk to our child(ren) – just be with our child(ren)? As we begin this new school year will we be able to answer the hard questions, whether we are positively seeking to serve the community and whether we seek to be subservient and adhere to wisdom and governance? Will we attend meetings, complete service hours, and support our child(ren)'s teacher? Will our children become better students? Have we considered our example of accountability as parents? Will we remind our students that they are expected to work hard and to take accountability for their work, through demonstrating that behavior for them? Will we expect them to be active participants in their education, not merely passive spectators? As faculty and staff will we accompany our students, each and every one, even when it is hard? Will we guide our students to wisdom and virtue through our own experiences, knowledge, and reliance on our faith? To all of these questions, I pray for a resounding, "YES!"

We learn through the model of Christ as our teacher and through the beautiful words of our patron that faith and reason must work together. "[f]aith and reason are like two wings on which the human spirit rises to the contemplation of truth; and God has placed in the human heart a desire to know the truth—in a word, to know himself—so that, by knowing and loving God, men and women may also come to the fullness of truth about themselves (cf. Ex 33:18; Ps 27:8-9; 63:2-3; Jn 14:8; 1 Jn 3:2)." Therefore, in seeking faith and reason, we also seek the truth. We seek the truth and know that the truth at its source is of the Holy Spirit (St. Thomas Aquinas) and we rely on the gifts of the Holy Spirit.

This is also the beginning of what He wants for us. The path of truth is not always easy, but it is undoubtedly worth it. It calls us to be honest with ourselves, to confront our fears and weaknesses, and to embrace vulnerability. When we choose to follow the Holy Spirit's guidance, we surrender our own desires and submit our open hearts to Christ. This divine connection allows us to tap into wisdom beyond our own understanding, leading us towards the path of righteousness and fulfillment. Remember that this is not just

a temporary endeavor; it is an invitation for a lifelong commitment. It is precisely what Christ desires for us.

This year we desire to enter into this partnership with each of you, rooted in faith and reason, seeking the truth and discovering the richness of the gifts of the Holy Spirit. We invite you to join in, to join us in the pursuit of holiness and in bringing our children one step closer to becoming saints.

ARRIVAL & DISMISSAL

Our first day of school is Thursday, August 10th. Students can be dropped off as early as 7:30 a.m. The bell rings at 7:55 a.m. Students who arrive to their classroom after 7:55 a.m. are considered tardy and a parent must sign student in at the Front Office and receive a tardy slip, which admits them to their first hour class. Dismissal is at 3:10 p.m. Carline for Arrival and Dismissal will follow the same procedure. See below.



CARLINE PROCEDURES

Carline begins at the school's entrance, Oak Alley, and flows counter-clockwise around the Main Building. Once behind the Main Building you will see the "drop-off zone". No students are allowed to be dropped off or picked up in the gravel parking lots.

Pre-K

On the first day of school, Thursday, August 10 through Monday, August 14 all parents of Pre-K students are invited to park in the JPG parking lot and walk their students to class.

Kindergarten

Parents will be allowed to park in the JPG parking lot and walk their Kindergartener to class on the first day of school, Thursday, August 10 and Friday, August 11 only.

BEFORE & AFTER CARE

All Before & After Care forms must be completed and turned into the front office by the first day of school. Digital forms are available on the website.

Families can email the front office if their child will need to be dropped off earlier than 7:30 a.m. for Before Care or will need to stay later than school hours for After Care.

Before Care begins at 7:15 a.m. until carline starts at 7:30 a.m. If you are not utilizing before care, please avoid using the right lane prior to 7:30 a.m to allow for the flow of traffic for before care drop-off. After Care begins at the end of carline at 3:45 p.m. and ends at 5:30 p.m.
