Faith Formation

Faith Formation Registration

It is time to register for all Faith Formation (RE) programs, preschool through high school, including the sacraments of First Communion, First Reconciliation and Confirmation.

Forms are available on the parish website. Go to the home page and scroll to the very bottom of the page to find the link beneath "I want to register my child in Faith Formation." Only one form is needed per family.

Information about Faith Formation programs can be found on the parish website beneath the Faith Formation Tab. Here you will find information by age group. You will also find the registration form beneath each age group.

Sacrament of First Holy Communion

First Holy Communion preparation is a two year program. The first year is for children first grade and older. Within this first year children begin learning in community and are introduced to the basics of our Catholic Faith. (The first year may have been completed at another parish. You will need to provide the parish name and contact information.) The second year is for children second grade and older. Within this year, children will focus on the Church's teachings specifically pertaining to the Sacrament of Reconciliation and First Holy Communion.

Children must be baptized prior to entering the second year of the program. If your child has not been baptized, or was baptized into another Christian faith, please contact Violet Wanner in the parish office.

Registration takes place at the end of August and beginning of September. Classes begin on Sunday mornings mid-September. Please use the Faith Formation registration form as noted under Faith Formation registration. Note there is an additional charge of \$25 for the second year of the program.

Sacrament of Confirmation

This sacrament is for High School Youth ninth grade and older. The classes begin on Sunday, October 12, 1:00 pm -2:45 pm. Classes will meet approximately twice per month with two required retreats, fall and spring.

Registration takes place at the end of August and beginning of September. Please use the Faith Formation registration form as noted under Faith Formation Registration. Note the fee includes two retreats and additional materials that will be utilized throughout the year. The fee can be paid all at once or in payments throughout the year.

All catechists, preschool through high school (including Children's Liturgy of the Word), are asked to attend a short training session on Sunday, September 14 following the 10:30 am Mass. We will have a light lunch together followed by faith enrichment and classroom training.

Preschool/Kindergarten

The Preschool/Kindergarten class is a mixed ages class, threes to Kinder, that brings the word of God to our Parish's youngest members. Children must be three, by September 1, and potty trained to enroll. Class takes place during the 10:30 am Mass. Children are dropped off before and picked up following Mass. Thanks to God's perfect timing, I am once again blessed to devote my time and energy to teaching, which is my first passion, and to music, which is my second passion. Imagine the bliss of teaching music then! I am excited and honored to enter the St. Francis School family, being entrusted with the education and nurture of your children. You know full well that your children are as much spirit and soul as they are mind and body. In music class, I am aware that I am able to touch your children as strongly through their spirits as through their minds, and I take this responsibility very seriously. In fact, I take this responsibility only with God's call, guidance and direction.
