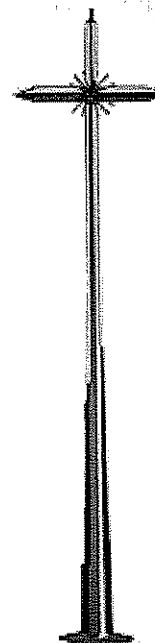

What's the Scoop in First Grade?

Our First Mass

The first grade class had the tremendous privilege of sponsoring the school Mass in honor of St. Francis on October 8. The excitement (and nerves) of the students was palpable as we began practicing for our Mass. When the day of the Mass finally arrived, we were no longer nervous, but rather full of pride. The Mass began with the children standing before the congregation with their favorite stuffed animals and leading the school in the prayer of St. Francis. Sponsoring the school Mass is a great honor and responsibility for such young children. They are just becoming readers and yet they are proclaiming God's word before the entire school at Mass! Despite how nerve wracking this may seem, the children returned to class after Mass that morning anxious to know when they would next sponsor a school Mass.

What we are learning

First grade is a big year. We are budding theologians, readers, writers, mathematicians, grammarians, linguists, scientists, artists and much more! We are busy learning various addition strategies in our math class. The children have learned about the types of sentences and are now exploring proper and common nouns as well as long vowel sounds and spelling patterns. In our Religion lessons, we have learned about God as our Creator and loving Father. We are also learning how to pray the rosary. We learned all about plants in our Science lessons. The students are now learning about the types of animals as well as what they need to survive. Preparations will soon begin for our presentation of "Squanto Helps the Pilgrims". Through this play, the children will reenact the story of the First Thanksgiving for their parents.

Humane Society Fundraiser

First grade social action service project is to raise funds and awareness in support of the Oregon Humane Society. We kicked off our fundraiser by creating irresistibly cute animal poster displays in the school halls, distributing flyers to our school families, and personally visiting each classroom to encourage the students to join us in supporting the animal shelters. Donations were collected from October 13-17. The final tally of funds collected is \$180.02! A representative from the Oregon Humane Society visited our class. She told the students more about the work that O.H.S. does to help animals. We got information from her about how we can use the funds we collected to sponsor one of the "Great Eight". These are dogs that have been in their care for the longest period of time. After spending some time reading the stories of the dogs, the class decided to sponsor a cute little dachshund mix named Billy.
