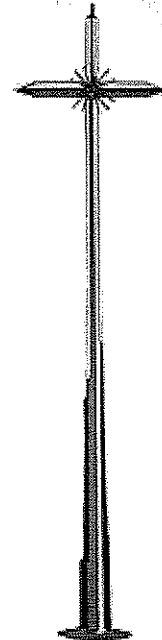

Catholic Corner

How can we practice the two great commandments? We can practice the two great commandments by fulfilling the Decalogue, or ten commandments, which explains how to love God, self and neighbor.

The commandments, "You shall not commit adultery, You shall not kill, You shall not steal, You shall not covet," and any other commandment, are summed up in this sentence, "You shall love your neighbor as yourself" (Rom. 13:9). (St. Paul Family Catechism, 571)

Respect Life

"Life is always a good. ... Why is life a good? This question is found everywhere in the Bible, and from the very first pages it receives a powerful and amazing answer. The life which God gives man is quite different from the life of all other living creatures, inasmuch as man, although formed from the dust of the earth (cf. Gen 2:7, 3:19; Job 34:15; Ps 103:14; 104:29), is a manifestation of God in the world, a sign of his presence, a trace of his glory (cf. Gen 1:26-27; Ps 8:6). This is what Saint Irenaeus of Lyons wanted to emphasize in his celebrated definition: 'Man, living man, is the glory of God'. Man has been given a sublime dignity, based on the intimate bond which unites him to his Creator: in man there shines forth a reflection of God himself" (The Gospel of Life, n. 34).

Baptism Guidelines

Do you want to have your child baptized at St. Francis Parish? There are several things to keep in mind when planning for the baptism.

- ◇ You **MUST** let the parish know at least three months before the day you want the child baptized. If you are pregnant, let us know three months before the scheduled birth date.
- ◇ The child **MUST** be less than 8 years of age, otherwise the program of RCIC (Rite of Christian Initiation for Children) applies. Call the parish office for details.
- ◇ You **MUST** be a registered member of St. Francis Parish.
- ◇ Both parents must attend with the prospective godparents if they are local, two training classes to understand your roles as parents and godparents in the raising of your child; and to also practice the rite of baptism.
- ◇ You **MUST** schedule a one-on-one visit with the pastor so he can get to know you a little better.

St. Francis and the Christmas Creche

In the year 1223, St. Francis was visiting the town of Greccio to celebrate Christmas. St. Francis realized that the chapel of the Franciscan hermitage would be too small to hold the congregation for Midnight Mass. So he found a niche in the rock near the town square and set up the altar. However, this Midnight Mass would be very special, unlike any other Midnight Mass.

St. Bonaventure (d. 1274) in his Life of St. Francis of Assisi tells the story the best:

It happened in the third year before his death, that in order to excite the inhabitants of Greccio to commemorate the nativity of the Infant Jesus with great devotion, St. Francis determined to keep it with all possible solemnity; and lest he should be accused of lightness or novelty, he asked and obtained the permission of the sovereign Pontiff. Then he prepared a manger, and brought hay, and an ox and an ass to the place appointed. The brethren were summoned, the people came together, the forest resounded with their voices, and that venerable night was made glorious by many and brilliant lights and sonorous psalms of praise. The man of God, St. Francis stood before the manger, full of devotion and piety, bathed in tears and radiant with joy; the Holy Gospel was chanted by Francis, the Levite of Christ. Then he preached to the people around the nativity of the poor King; and being unable to utter His name for the tenderness of His love, He called Him the Babe of Bethlehem.

Although the story is old, the message is clear for us. Our own Nativity scenes which rest under our Christmas trees are a visible reminder of that night when our Savior was born. May we never forget to see in our hearts the little Babe of Bethlehem, who came to save us from sin. We must never forget that the wood of the manger that held Him so securely would one day give way to the wood of the cross. May we too embrace Him with all of our love as did St. Francis. 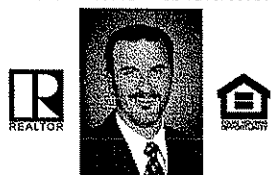

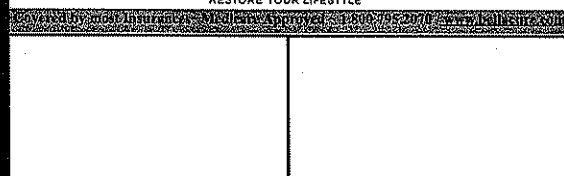
