40 Cans for 40 Days—Thank you to the Knights and to everyone who has been donating to our Lenten Food Drive. The food the Knights of Columbus collects each Sunday goes to the St. Francis Food Pantry, and more specifically, the Easter food baskets. During the past 2 years, this food drive has been a tremendous help, allowing us to fill over 40 Easter baskets while also restocking our pantry after the busy Lenten season.

While we will still have Easter food sign ups in the narthex for perishables (meat, milk, butter, eggs), we will not need to have sign ups in the narthex for nonperishables because of the support we receive from 40 Cans for 40 days.

St. Francis School

Accredited through June 2020

The season of Lent has begun and so has the 5th grade service project. In Religion class we learned the Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy. The students learned that the Works of Mercy are our way of continuing the work of Jesus. As a class, we will continue Jesus' work as we embark on Kids Against Poverty (K.A.P.).

Over the 6 weeks of Lent, 5th graders will learn about the challenges that developing countries, like Uganda, have, including malaria, water purification, high infant mortality, lack of vaccinations, and malnutrition. In class we will watch videos, have discussions, and read about the children in Uganda, specifically at a school in Mityana, Uganda. These children go to The Little Flower School run by the St. Kizito Parish Catholic Mission. The 5th graders will learn about the Mission and what the school day is like for the school children.

Throughout this service project, the 5th graders also take on great responsibility. Each student has a specific job such as presenting information to students in grades K-4, creating posters to display around the school, designing flyers to inform parents, collecting and counting the donations, and speaking during weekend Masses. A collection hut is placed in each classroom, the school office, and the church narthex, in which we collect donations that will be sent to the Carmelite Mission. In the past our donations were used for bed nets, water pumps, and medical care for the children.

Another exciting event upcoming for 5th grade is our annual Science Fair! The students have been working hard designing, researching, and conducting their experiments. Their final projects can be viewed at the Science Fair in the school gymnasium on March 18 from 6:00 pm—7:00 pm. Come and learn how gummy worms react in different liquids, what type of water filtration works best against chlorine, or what type of bread molds the fastest.
