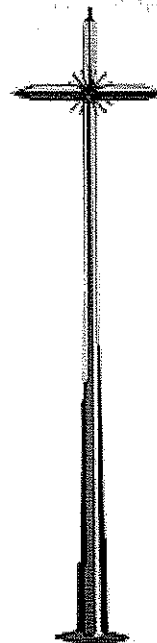

## From the Pastor

### **Understanding the Holy Mass: The Assembly**

(Excerpt from Fr. Jeremy Driscoll's *What Happens at Mass*)

Mass begins long before it begins...I am not talking about turning on the lights of the building and opening the doors, preparing the vessels and vestments, and getting the music sorted out. I am talking about the deep theological significance hidden in the arrival of many people coming from many places into one place to celebrate the Eucharist... The Greek word for *church* is *ekklesia*... Literally, it means "a calling out" and "a calling together." So, *church* means those called out from somewhere by God and called together into one place by Him. The Church is the gathering of those called by God; she is an assembly that God forms and keeps together. *To be continued.*

## Respect Life

"The Eucharist draws us into Jesus' act of self-oblation ... we enter into the very dynamic of His self-giving' (Encyclical Deus caritas est, 13). Let us live Lent then, as a 'Eucharistic' time in which, welcoming the love of Jesus, we learn to spread it around us with every word and deed. Contemplating "Him whom they have pierced" moves us in this way to open our hearts to others, recognizing the wounds inflicted upon the dignity of the human person; it moves us, in particular, to fight every form of contempt for life and human exploitation and to alleviate the tragedies of loneliness and abandonment of so many people. May Lent be for every Christian a renewed experience of God's love given to us in Christ, a love that each day we, in turn, must 'regive' to our neighbor, especially to the one who suffers most and is in need. Only in this way will we be able to participate fully in the joy of Easter" (Pope Benedict XVI, Lenten Message, 2007).

**40 Cans for 40 Days**—Thank you to the Knights and to everyone who has been donating to our Lenten Food Drive. The food the Knights of Columbus collects each Sunday goes to the St. Francis Food Pantry, and more specifically, the Easter food baskets. During the past 2 years, this food drive has been a tremendous help, allowing us to fill over 40 Easter baskets while also restocking our pantry after the busy Lenten season.

While we will still have Easter food sign ups in the narthex for perishables (meat, milk, butter, eggs), we will not need to have sign ups in the narthex for nonperishables because of the support we receive from 40 Cans for 40 days.

Below is the schedule for the type of food we are collecting each week. However, we are more than happy to take items past their "collection date" and will accept any food items throughout Lent. Thank you for your support!

# St. Francis School

## **"What does it mean to attend a Catholic School?"**

We asked our fifth graders this question. Their responses highlight that St. Francis School is: a community of faith where children are openly taught about God; a community that passes on knowledge – not just the practical knowledge of reading, writing and arithmetic, but also the knowledge of God and truth; and a community of service, where helping one another and aiding the needy are the normal way of life.

"Catholic School means faith because you believe in God. Catholic School also means love because the golden rule is 'Love your neighbor as yourself.' The last thing that Catholic School means is charity because everyone should be kind enough to share and be charitable. Catholic School means 'Awesome'!"

"It means to me Jesus' teachings because in Catholic Schools you learn religion. You also go to Mass where you learn Jesus' teachings. It means triumph because in Catholic Schools you learn that God will never be angry. He will forgive you always no matter what."

"It means to me we can learn about Jesus. I am very glad that we learn about Jesus because He saved us from sin. Being in a Catholic School is very peaceful and I feel grateful to be in one."

"Everyone shares kindness and faith. I also think Catholic Schools are wonderful because we can learn about God. I think that people can share their own special talents. I am blessed to be able to get the education and spirit in a Catholic School."

"To me, Catholic School means Christ. We get to have religion class almost every day. We learn about Jesus and all the things He does for us. We also pray every morning, before lunch and at the end of the day. The whole school gets to go to church every Wednesday together."

"The things that make my school special is that we can pray and learn more about God. The teachers at our school will help you no matter what. I also think our school is special because the kids are happy. All of my friends have my back. And they will never let me down. And also whenever you are sad someone will help you feel better. And if you are alone at recess someone will get you and play with you."

"Catholic School means learning about and believing in God, Jesus Christ and the Holy Spirit. I love religion because it helps me grow deeper into my faith. It also means friendship and cooperation. Everyone is kind and gets along well with others. No one is rude or snotty. It's a great environment. Catholic School is Great!"
